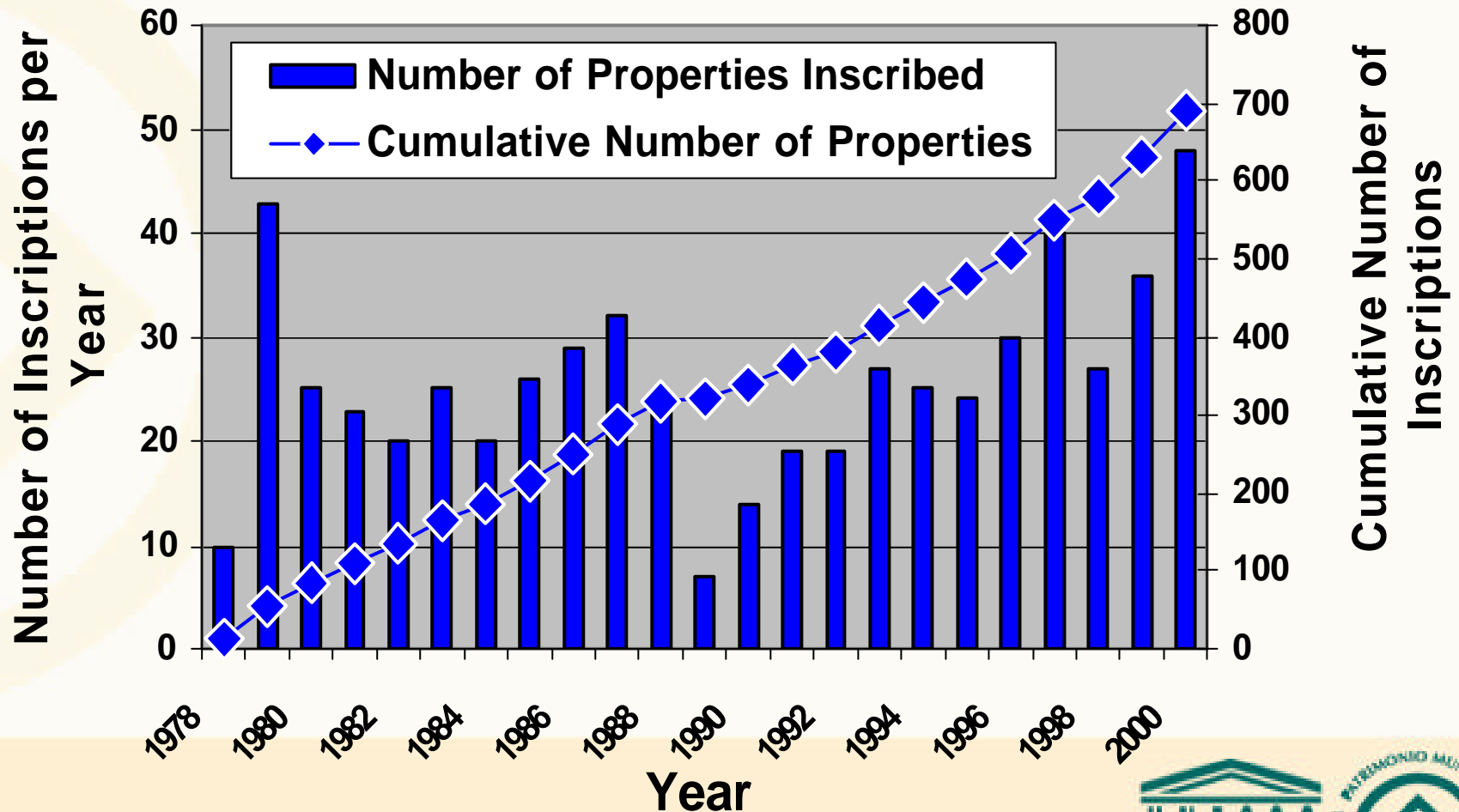

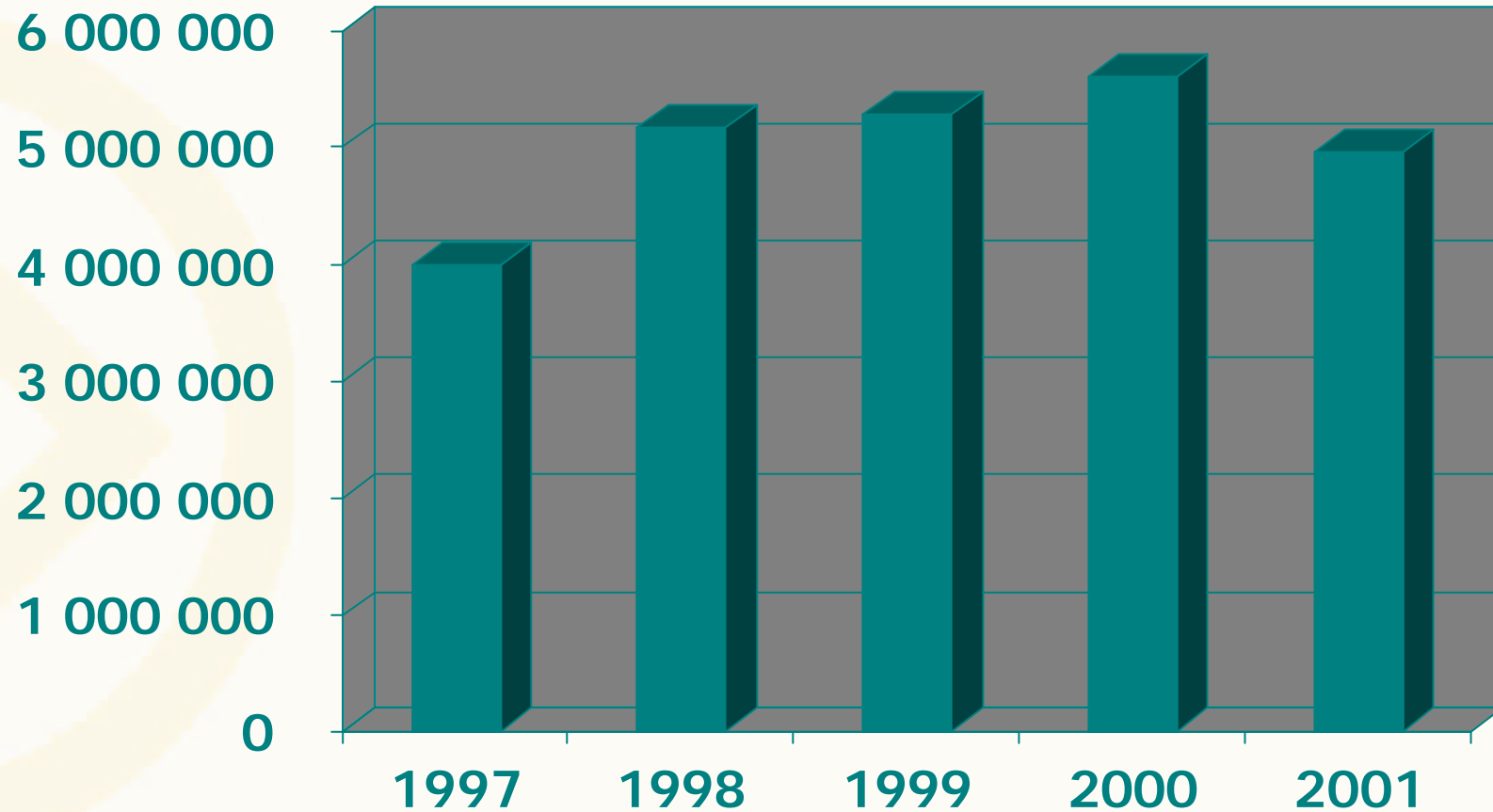

Amounts in US\$



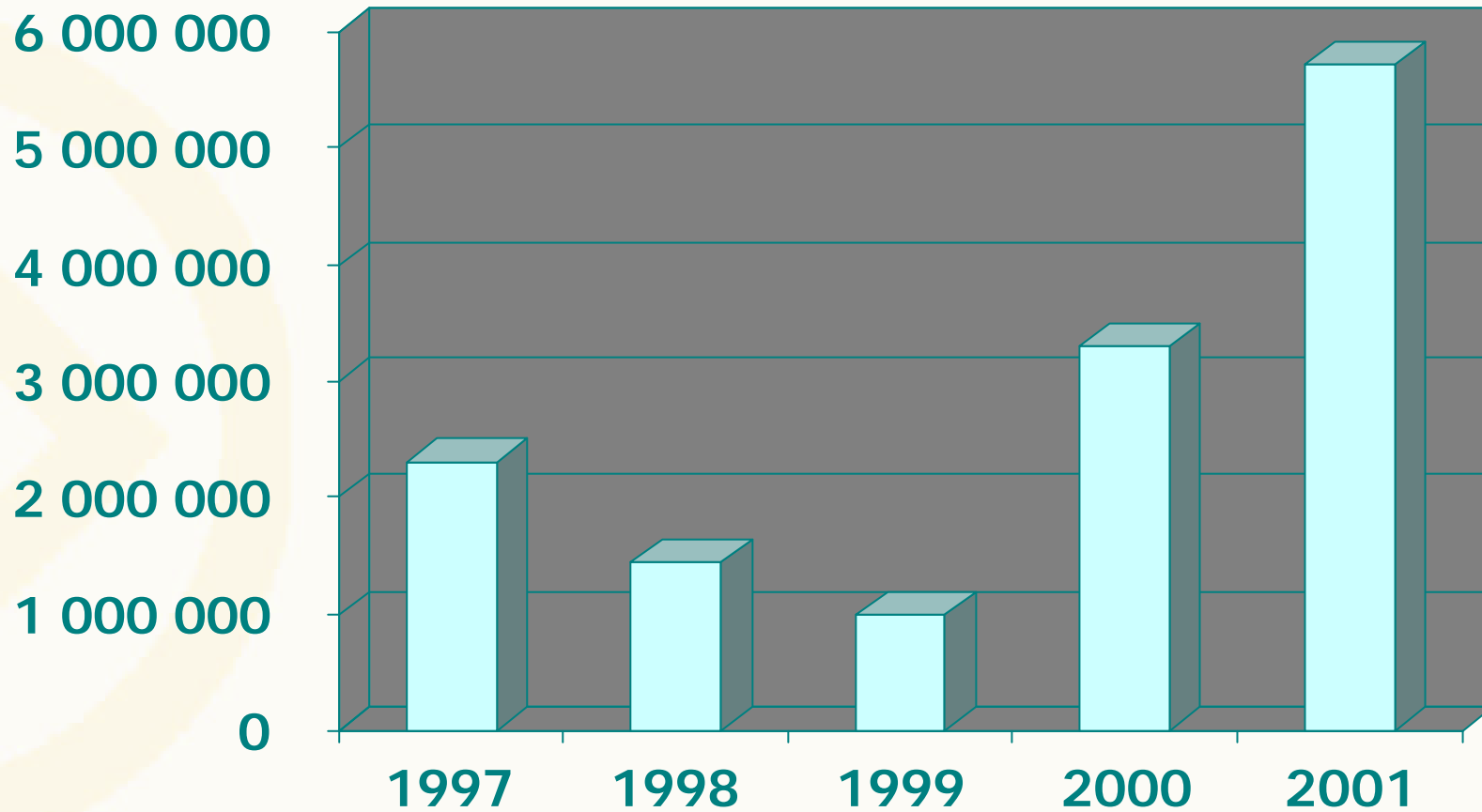

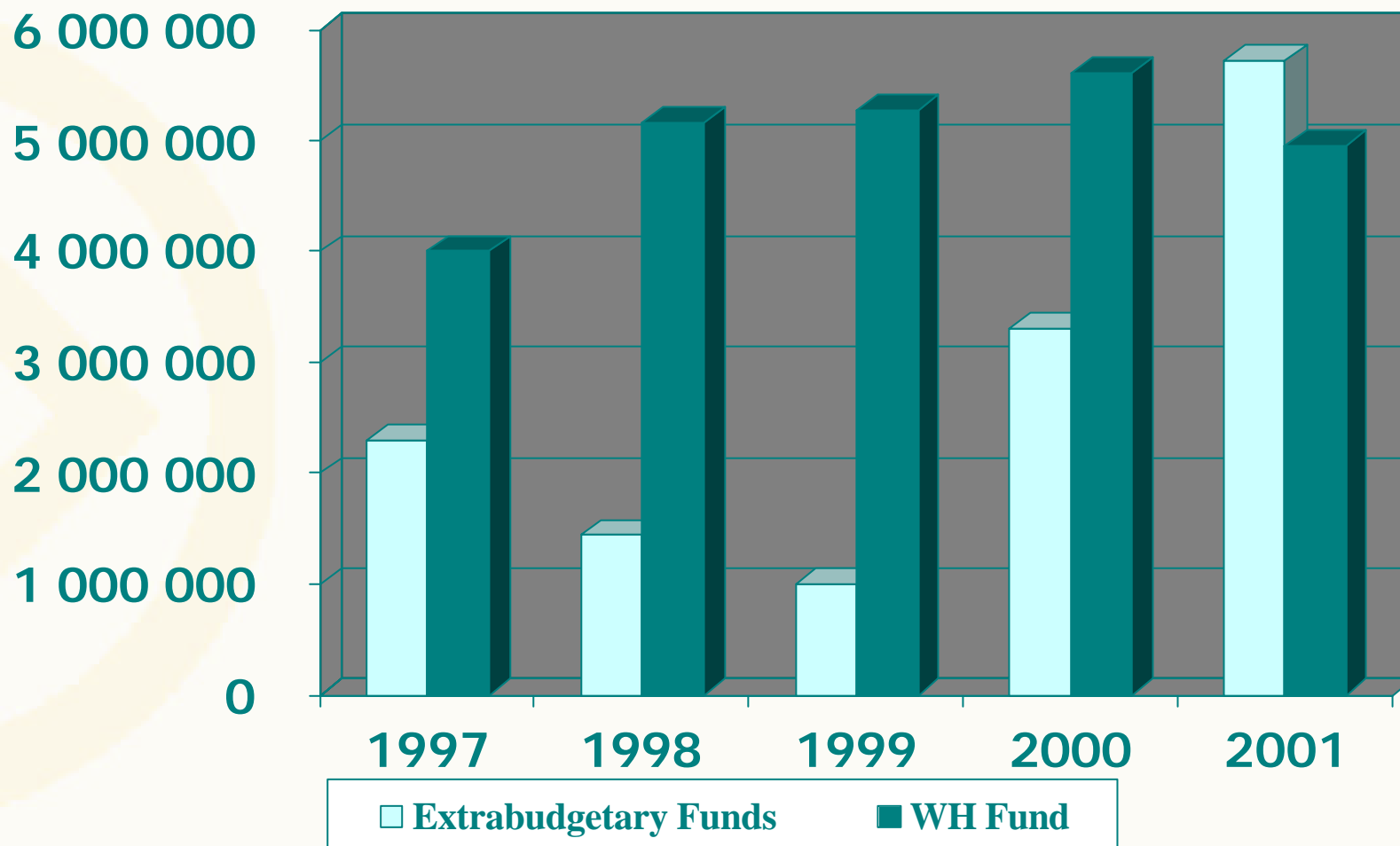

# **UN FOUNDATION/UNESCO PARTNERSHIP FOR WORLD HERITAGE BIODIVERSITY SITES**

- **UN FOUNDATION ESTABLISHED IN 1998  
– TO MANAGE TED TURNER DONATION  
OF US\$ 1 BILLION TO THE UN – A US  
PUBLIC, “SPEND OUT” (IN 10 YEARS)  
CHARITY**

**COUNTERPART UNIT IN UN NEW YORK –  
UN FUND FOR INTERNATIONAL  
PARTNERSHIPS (UNFIP)**



- **PROGRAMME PRIORITIES:  
POPULATION AND WOMEN; CHILD  
HEALTH; AND ENVIRONMENT -  
SUSTAINABLE ENERGY/CLIMATE  
CHANGE AND BIODIVERSITY; ALL  
PROJECTS EXECUTED VIA UN  
AGENCIES/PROGRAMMES**



- **BIODIVERSITY PROGRAMME FRAMEWORK OF UNF/UNFIP – ADOPTED IN NOVEMBER 1999 – PRIORITY SUPPORT FOR WORLD HERITAGE SITES MEETING, OR HAVING THE POTENTIAL TO MEET, NATURAL HERITAGE CRITERIA (IV) – BIODIVERSITY OF OUTSTANDING UNIVERSAL SIGNIFICANCE**
