I can ensure you that we will continue to work with the Mexican authorities to monitor the state of conservation of the site and to guarantee that the values for which the site has been inscribed on the World Heritage List be protected for future generations.

I wish to thank you for your support in the implementation of the World Heritage Convention and for your interest in safeguarding the Whale Sanctuary of El Viscaino in Mexico.
