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1 Executive Summary of the report

The report for the state of conservation of historic centres of Berat and Gjirokastra was prepared in response to decision 39 COM 7B.75 and in compliance to the format for submission of SoC reports in the Operational Guidelines 2015.

In chapter 2, this report focuses on the points of the most recent Decision of World Heritage Committee and gives information regarding the updates in legislation such as the new adopted regulation for the protection, integrated conservation and administration of the Historic Centre and Buffer Zone of Gjirokastra (section 2.1 and Annex 1). In section 2.2 the Report provides information regarding the issue of risk management in both sites and the new developments regarding the training of site managers and raise of awareness for this very important issue. The series of trainings organized by UNESCO Venice Office in 2011, 2014, 2015 regarding risk management in World Heritage sites have been very helpful and a very good basis for the continuation of work on preparation of risk management plans.

Section 2.3 gives information on the work done by the respective municipalities regarding the strategic documents of Strategy for Tourism Development and General Local Urban Plans. The new law "On the territorial and administrative division of local government units in the Republic of Albania", as explained in this section demands the updating and in some parts revising these strategic documents. The respective municipalities are in the process of revising the strategic documents according the updates in this Law. This is considered a great opportunity for the correlation of all these strategic documents to each other and to the policies for protection and management of Outstanding Universal Value of both historic centres.

Section 2.4 refers to the monitoring indicators. The lack of specific monitoring indicators was identified as a factor that affects the property since its nomination as World Heritage. Being aware of the importance of the monitoring process, in October 2015, The State Party has requested to the World Heritage Centre technical assistance for the relevant Authorities regarding the development of the monitoring indicators as requested by the World Heritage Committee.

Section 2.5 refers to the situation of the fire hydrants system in both Historic Centres. In the historic centre of Berat, there is an installed and functional system of hydrants only for the inhabited quarter of the Castle. Fire protection remains still a problem for the Mangalem and Gorica Quarters. In Gjirokastra, the municipality has installed 12 (twelve) new hydrants in the historic centre, close to important monuments and facilities and plans to add 8 (eight) more hydrants in 2016.

Chapter 3 provides information regarding the recently proclaimed monuments of 1st and 2nd category in the Historic centre of Berat, as well as a list of buildings without status in the historic centre (Annex 2) (requirement of the new regulation adopted). Also information regarding the work done for the preparation of detailed schedules for monuments in the historic centre of Gjirokastra is provided in this chapter. Section 3.3 (Annex 3) and 3.4 (Annex 4) give information regarding investments done in both sites during 2015.

In chapter 4 the State Party gives information regarding an international competition for "Design of new by-pass road in the Historic centre of Gjirokastra". The state party has already informed the World Heritage Centre and also has provided the comments of the advisory bodies to the organizers of the competition. The state party shall inform the World Heritage Centre on the results of this competition.

2 Response to the Decision of the World Heritage Committee 39 COM 78.75.

2.1 Regulation for the protection, integrated conservation, and administration of the Historic Centre and Buffer Zone of Gjirokastra

The Regulation for the protection, integrated conservation, and administration of the Historic Centre and Buffer zone of Gjirokastra was adopted by Decision of Council of Ministers, DCM No. 619, date 7/7/2015. The Regulation defines the obligations, ways of protection, conservation and integrated management of cultural and historic values of the Historic Centre and Buffer Zone of Gjirokastra, World Heritage Property. It is based on Law no. 9048, dated 07.04.2003 "On cultural heritage" (as amended) and in DCM No.426, dated 13.07.2007 "On approval of the Albanian Restoration Charter". It has been prepared in close collaboration between the Institute of Cultural Monuments, Regional Directorate of National Culture Gjirokastra and Municipality of Gjirokastra.

The regulation establishes the structure of the historic part of the city of Gjirokastra, defining the Historic Centre and Buffer Zone. The borders of the Historic Centre and its Buffer Zone are the same with the area nominated World Heritage and Buffer Zone in 2005. The buffer zone is subdivided in different subzones by identifying green areas within it.

The criteria and guidelines for conservation and restoration interventions in the Historic Centre and Buffer Zone is set in accordance with the special characteristics of each area and with the main aim of protecting the OUV of the WH property. The regulation requires the compilation and proclamation of the list of 2^{nd} category monuments within the Historic Centre.

The regulation defines the ways of collaboration between specialized institutions depending from the Ministry of Culture and the local government, as well as with other institutions, organizations and private subjects for the effective protection, integrated conservation and management of the outstanding cultural values of the historic centre.

The regulation was approved after being discussed by the respective authorities, Scientific Council of the Institute of Cultural Monuments and the National Council of Restoration.

2.2 Risk Management in both Historic Centres

In 2011, the UNESCO Venice Office initiated a series of training workshops (2011, 2014) focused on Disaster Risk Preparedness and Management in World Heritage Sites in Albania. The objectives of this initiative (workshops) are:

1. Raise awareness among professionals and responsible agencies for the need to develop appropriate disaster risk management plans;

- 2. Raise capacity in developing appropriate regimes of risk management in major cultural sites of Albania;
- 3. Lay the groundwork for the development of a disaster risk management plan in selected cultural sites, which can act as a model for other sites in Albania and within the region.

In this regard, site Managers of Berat and Gjirokastra (respective RDNCs) together with representatives from relevant national agencies have participated discussing and trained on issues, challenges that should be considered during the preparation of a Disaster Risk Management Plan. Following these workshops both RDNCs started collection of primary data, as a preparatory phase for the drafting process of Disaster Risk Management plan.

The Historic Centre of Berat and Gjirokastra, (together with Ancient City of Butrint and Ancient City of Apolonia) are casestudy of the publication "Disaster Risk Management of Cultural Heritage Sites in Albania", published by CNR - National Research Council, Italy IGAG - Institute of Environmental Geology and Geoengineering, coordinated by UNESCO, Venice Office.

As follow up of these trainings, important measures have been taken in order to intensify the cooperation with local governments, police service and Fire Brigades (Services).

Recently, during 13 - 20 November 2015, RDNC – Berat and Gjirokastra participated in the Training Workshop on "Disaster Risk Reduction for Designated UNESCO Sites in the Mediterranean". This training was useful to complete the knowledge for the preparation and monitoring risk management plans for WH sites focused on concrete cases and practical exercises.

2.3 Tourism Development Strategies and General Urban Plans

Based on the Law No.115/2014 "On the administrative territorial division of local government units in the Republic of Albania", there are established new local government units (61 municipalities and 12 regions). They are larger in terms of population, and also larger in terms of territory size, which would enable the achievement of "economy of scale" and efficiency of public services on the one hand, and observing traditional historical-geographical borders that also allow for the prospective urban and space development.

Both municipalities of Berat and Gjirokastra have prepared and adopted since 2011 respective documents "Strategy for the Development of Tourism - 2011-2021". In the framework of the New Territorial Reform, the newly constituted municipality of Gjirokastra has larger territory size by including also 6 (six) of the former commune areas which bear important touristic resources. The strategic document will be revised and updated following the new developments in the respective legislation. The strategic document that the municipality of Berat has adopted since 2011 has been prepared taking into consideration the whole Berat region. The Municipality of Berat will update and revise the regional strategic document after the adoption of the National Strategy for Tourism Development 2015-2020.

The newly constituted municipality of Berat has just started the process of preparation of the local urban plan in the framework of the Planning and Local Governance Project in Albania (PLGP), funded by USAID and based on cooperation agreement between the Albanian Government and the municipalities of Berat, Fier, Luzhnje, Elbasan and Kuçova. The municipality of Berat is in the process of updating and consolidating the database that will serve as a basis for territorial analysis, plan development, regulation and Strategic Environmental Assessment. Also the newly constituted municipality of Gjirokastra has just started the process of preparation of the local urban plan. Both municipalities are closely collaborating with the Institute of Cultural Monuments and respective RDNCs for the updating of data on cultural heritage monuments and areas as well as the national policies for cultural heritage protection.

Both municipalities are aware that these strategic documents must be correlated to each other and to the policies for the protection of outstanding universal value that both historic centres bear and this is a main challenge for the State Party. The revising process is a great opportunity for the above mentioned correlation, and site managers (respective RDNCs) are already part of the working groups in charge.

2.4 A focused set of Monitoring Indicators with a clear articulation of the attributes of OUV

The lack of specific monitoring indicators was identified as a factor that affects the property since its nomination as World Heritage. The need for the development and implementation of adequate monitoring indicators have been clearly expressed in the decisions: 33 COM 7B.87, 35 COM 7B.82 and Decision: 37 COM 7 B.70. Even though the State Party has made efforts in preparing a list of monitoring indicators and explained it through the SOC reports, the 2012 reactive monitoring mission report stated that "detailed inventories related to attributes which carry Outstanding Universal Value still do not exist". Through the most recent decision 39 COM 7B.75, the World Heritage Committee still requests the State Party to prepare a focused set of monitoring indicators with a clear articulation of the attributes of OUV.

In October 2015, The State Party has requested, to the World Heritage Centre, technical assistance for the relevant Authorities regarding the development of the monitoring indicators as requested by the World Heritage Committee. The foreseen project includes a theoretical workshop that aims at training the participants on the guidelines and methodology for defining and linking values to attributes to indicators. It also includes site visits to both historic centers and consultation with site managers and local governments aiming at the identification of all values present in the sites and developing monitoring indicators in practice. The project will lead in the development and implementation of a focused set of monitoring indicators clearly related to the attributes of OUV.

2.5 Fire Hydrants

2.5.1 <u>Historic centre of Gjirokastra</u>

In response to the request of the Ministry of Culture, Institute of Cultural Monuments and World Heritage Centre, the Municipality of Gjirokastra has installed 12 (twelve) new hydrants in the

Historic Centre of Gjirokastra. They are installed during 2014 and are functional. These hydrants are installed in proximity of designated buildings of 1st and 2nd category as well as close to important facilities as follows:

- 1. In close proximity to Angonatët house
- 2. In close proximity to Gurgait house
- 3. In close proximity to Fico house
- 4. In close proximity to Kokobobo house
- 5. In close proximity to Babameto house
- 6. Partizani Quarter (two hydrants)
- 7. Old Bazaar Quarter (two hydrants)
- 8. 11 Janari Quarter (two hydrants)
- 9. Palorto Quarter close to Babaramo house

These hydrants are connected to the city water supply network and are functional. The fact that the city does not have 24-hours water supply is a major problem for the immediate functioning of the hydrants in case of fire. However there is an organized teamwork between the Water Service Enterprise and the Fire Brigade (Service). In case of fire or emergency the water distribution network (System) is immediately opened.

The Municipality of Gjirokastra has foreseen the extension of the number of hydrants, by installing 8 other hydrants as follows:

- 1. Old Bazaar Quarter
- 2. Dunavat II Quarter (two)
- 3. Cfakë Quarter (two)
- 4. Manalat Quarter (two)
- 5. Palorto Quarter next to the Ethnographic Museum

2.5.2 Historic Centre of Berat

Fire protection of the whole Historic Centre of Berat still remains as an existing problem. A proper hydrant network is installed in the inhabited area of the Castle in the framework of the revitalization of Cultural Heritage project, funded by the European Commission. The Mangalem and Gorica quarters still lack the fire protection measures (installed system of hydrants).

Berat Municipality with the collaboration of UNESCO Venice Office and UNESCO Headquarters has applied to the Horizon 2020 DRS-11-2015 project within the European Commission program on Disaster Resilience & Climate Change topic 3: Mitigating the impacts of climate change and natural hazards on cultural heritage sites, structures and artefacts.

The draft proposal is called Heritage Management and Protection of Natural Hazards Risk Reduction and Climate Change - CHANCE ", which will be led by Tecnalia (Spain).

Berat is one of the beneficiaries for testing results and solutions that will be provided by this project. CHANCE activities will demonstrate a variety of advanced services for testing

purposes, including eco-innovative solutions, capacity building activities on risk management methodology, advanced systems for monitoring and evaluation of natural risks, etc. UNESCO will perform the functions of coordination, networking and planning with assets of UNESCO.

3 Other current conservation issues identified by the State(s) Party(ies) which may have an impact on the property's Outstanding Universal Value

3.1 Proclamation of the 2nd category monuments in the Historic Centre of Berat

The new adopted regulation for the administration of Historic Centre of Berat required the proclamation of monuments of 2nd category (as per legislation on cultural heritage) and the identification of buildings without status within the Historic Centre. Based on this requirement, after the adoption of the Regulation, the Regional Directorate of National Culture in Berat has proposed to the Minister of Culture a list of monuments that displayed values to be proclaimed 2nd category monuments and a number of monuments to be added to the list of 1st category. This list was approved by the National Council of Restoration, Decision no. 41, date 05.03.2015 and is now official. Based on the study of the RDNC Berat there are a number of 11 buildings in the Historic Centre that don't display values and as such don't have the status "monument".

3.2 Second category monuments in the historic centre of Gjirokastra

The new adopted regulation for the protection, integrated management and administration of Historic Centre of Gjirokastra requires the proclamation of monuments of 2nd category (as per legislation on cultural heritage) and the identification of buildings without status within the Historic Centre. Based on this requirement, after the adoption of the Regulation, the Regional Directorate of National Culture of Gjirokastra is in the process of preparation of dettailed schedules for each building located within the historic centre based on archival information, cadastral maps, ortho-photos etc. Up to now 50% of the schedules are completed; (which means that from RDNC's list which counts a number of 460 2nd category monuments, about 240 schedules have been completed). After the completion of all the dettailed schedules, RDNC Gjirokastra shall follow the same procedure as RDNC Berat for the official proclamation of 2nd category monuments and identification of the buildings without status. The working group has faced some problems related to the identification of owners (sometimes there are a large number of owners), cadastral zone, noncompatibility between the RDNC list and property register list regarding the name of ownership, accessibility problems in some of the buildings due to difficult steep terrain and abandonement.

During 2015, RDNC Gjirokastra in collaboration with CHwB and Epoka University have prepared a condition assessment of 1st and 2nd category monuments in the Historic Centre of Gjirokastra. The goal of the assessment was to analyze the condition of 658 buildings and classify them as per needed intervention priority. The methodology focused on developed matrix where cross-referencing condition / occupancy / use, risk category and historical content results


in categorization of a priority for intervention. The assessment results in a proposed set of actions for both monuments of 1^{st} and 2^{nd} category.

3.3 Investment in the historic centre of Berat during 2015

During 2015, RDNC Berat has undertaken a number of maintenance works financed by State Budget and the Municipality of Berat.

3.5 General inventory of monuments

In 2014 the Ministry of Culture has initiated the updating process of the National List of Monuments through the dettailed inventory of monuments. The Regional Directorates of National Culture in close collaboration with the Institute of Cultural Monuments have prepared and completed dettailed schedules for each of the monuments in the National List and have also updated the information regarding the location of the monuments using gps devices. The Institute of Cultural Monuments is carrying out a project for the digitization of the Cultural Heritage. The project aims at:

- 1. Developing and implementing a unified spatial database on the descriptive data, geographical position for each monument, and other related documents.
- 2. Building a Web-GIS application, centralized database for all spatial information and their attributes:
- 3. Creating a dynamic digital map consultable by all concerned stakeholders (different levels of users)

This project is expected to be finalized by the end of 2015. At the same time ICOMOS Albania has initiated a project funded by the US Ambassador Fund for the digitization of the christian

religious monuments. Implementation of both projects is being coordinated by the Institute of Cultural Monuments.

3.6 Kadare House, Historic Centre of Gjirokastra

The restoration works of Kadare House, 2nd category monument, funded by State Budget and UNESCO are undergoing and shall be completed within January 2016. The second phase of this project includes the revitalization of Kadare House as a museum, international artistic and cultural centre. This Centre is planned to be part of the european network of writers residencies. The Ministry of Culture and the Municipality of Gjirokastra have signed in November 2015 a cooperation agreement for the implementation of this second phase. The overall project aims at:

- 1. Improvement of the cultural and architectural landscape close to the monument.
- 2. Improvement of quality of public services in the Historic Centre of Gjirokastra
- 3. Become part of a european community of writers, translators engaged in dialogue through face-to-face meetings and online network.
- 4. International promotion of the Historic Center of Gjirokastra through hosting international writers and translators in the House.

3.7 The 2015 Edition of the National Folk Festival (Argjiro Fest_ON)

The National Folk Festival is one of the most important festivals in Albania and takes place every four years, traditionally in Gjirokastra. The first Folk Festival was organized in 1968 and since then brings together more and more artists each year, not just from Albania, but also from around the world. The festival is the best exhibition of Albanian traditions, including music, instruments, folk art and traditional costumes. One of the highlights of this festival is the isopoliphony style of Albanian folk singing, which is protected by UNESCO as "intangible cultural heritage." The most recent Edition of this Festival – Argjiro Fest_ON - has taken place in may 2015 in the Castle of Gjirokastra. This great event was organized by the Ministry of Culture and gathered together about 2300 art performers and about 300 invited artists. Several conservation and maintenance works were carried out in the Historic Centre of Gjirokastra and mainly in the Castle area in the framework of the international event.

In conformity with Paragraph 172 of the *Operational Guidelines*, describe any potential major restorations, alterations and/or new construction(s) intended within the property, the buffer zone(s) and/or corridors or other areas, where such developments may affect the Outstanding Universal Value of the property, including authenticity and integrity.

4.1 International Competition – Call for Desing of By-Pass road in the Historic Centre of Gjirokastra – World Heritage

In accordance with the paragraph 172 of the Operational Guidelines, in November 3rd, 2015 the Institute of Cultural Monuments has informed the World Heritage Centre as follows:

On October, 27th, Atelier Albania by request of the Ministry of Culture and mandated by the office of the Prime Minister, has announced an international urban design competition to collect design proposals for a Bypass Road in the Historic Centre of Gjirokastra (World Heritage Property). The introduction of a bypass road is considered an immediate need for the improvement of the vehicle circulation and the protection of the historic centre. The terms of

references are prepared in collaboration with the Institute of Cultural Monuments, and in accordance with the Regulation for the administration of the Historic Centre.

Briefly the Terms of References specify that:

"The city of Gjirokastra is considered a unique city with regards to its urban and architectural composition. The main aim of this competition is to call for design proposals that will provide the Bypass Road trajectory and design, which after being constructed will take the traffic off the Bazaar area of Gjirokastra, by transforming it into a pedestrianized area. All these should be performed without tackling the character and authenticity of the area subject to this competition. This project aims at improving car mobility and returning the historical centre back to its identity. Through this open call Atelier Albania is searching for multidisciplinary teams of architects, urban designers and planners, road engineers, transport and heritage experts that will generate tailor made and original proposals, highlighting and protecting the exiting historical and cultural values of the city, while at the same time offering intelligent solutions to the traffic and mobility issues of the city. Through this competition, that is not merely an engineering question, it is aimed for an integrated solution."

The deadline for submission of the phase one is 10 November, 2015. The deadline for submission of the phase two is 10 December, 2015. The announcement of the results is 21 December, 2015.

In November, 16th, 2015 the World Heritage Centre has sent via electronic mail the ICOMOS comments on this project to the State Party representatives. The Institute of Cultural Monuments has sent the ICOMOS comments to the organizers of the competition as well as to the site managers and local government of Gjirokastra.

The State Party shall inform the World Heritage centre on the results of the international competition.

DECISION

No. 619, date 7.7.2015

FOR PROCLAIMING"HISTORIC CENTER" OF AN AREA IN THE CITY OF GJIROKASTRA ANDAPPROVAL OF THE REGULATION"ON THE PROTECTION, INTEGRATEDCONSERVATIONANDMANAGEMENT OF THE HISTORICALCENTERAND THE PROTECTED AREAIN THE CITY OF GJIROKASTRA"

Pursuant to Article 100 of the Constitution and sections 3 and 4 of article 29 of the Law no. 9048, dated 07.04.2003, "On cultural heritage", amended, by the Minister of Culture proposal, the Council of Ministers

DECIDED:

- 1. Proclaiming "Historical Center" of an area in the city of Gjirokastra, according to the map and geographic coordinates, attached to this decision.
- 2. Approval of the Regulation "On the protection, integrated conservation and management of the Historical Center and the Protected Area in the city of Gjirokastra", which is attached to this decision as integral part hereof.
- Decisionno.832, dated 11.12.2003, of the Council of Ministers "For approval of the regulation for the management of the City-Museum of Gjirokastra", amended, is abolished.
- 4. The Ministry of Culture and the Ministry of Urban Development are in charged for the implementation of this decision.

This decision shall enter into force after its publication in the Official Bulletin.

REGULATION

"ON THE PROTECTION, INTEGRATED CONSERVATION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE HISTORICAL CENTER AND THE PROTECTED AREA IN THE CITY OF GJIROKASTRA"

Article 1

Purpose and Objectives

This regulation defines the obligations and ways of protecting, integrated conserving and the management of historical-cultural values and landscape values of the Historical Center and Protected Area of the city of Gjirokastra. For the important historical-cultural values, historic Gjirokastra, with the decision no. 172, dated 2.6.1961, of the Council of Ministers, is proclaimed "City-Museum" and it is putted under state protection.

For the universal incomparable values, the Historical Center of Gjirokastra is proclaimed World Heritage Asset in the year 2005, based on criteria "III" and "IV"¹, and is expanded in 2008 including the Historical Center of Berat both set as "series heritage asset" as rare examples of the typical architecture of the Ottoman period (c. XVI - XX).

The main objectives of this regulation are:

- 1. The protection, preservation, maintenance and restoration of the historic and cultural values and landscape values of the Historic Center of Gjirokastra.
- 2. Management of the Historic Center of Gjirokastra according the zoning presented in the map attached to this regulation as integral part hereof.
- 3. The forms of cooperation with the units of the local government of the city of Gjirokastra for management, protection and restoration of the values of cultural heritage and landscape of the Historic Center of Gjirokastra.

Article 2

¹ To be included in the List of World Heritage Asset, sites must provide unmatched universal values and meet at least one of the selection criteria. Criterion "iii" - Unique or extraordinary evidence of a cultural tradition or civilization still alive or that has been disappeared. Criterion "iv" - specific example of a type of building or architectural or technological ensemble that indicates a/some stage/s in the history of mankind.

This regulation is in accordance with the Constitution of the Republic of Albania, Law no. 9048, dated 07.04.2003, "On cultural heritage" amended, Law no. 9386, dated 04.05.2005, "On museums", "Albanian Restoration Charter" approved by Decision no. 426, dated 13.7.2007, of the Council of Ministers, agreements and other documents in the field of cultural heritage and cultural landscape, ratified according the Albanian legislation.

Article 3

Urban space in protection

The urban space of the city of Gjirokastra in protection comprises:

- 1. Historical Center:
- 2. Protected Area.

Within these areas there are included historical ensembles, green areas, first category monuments and second category monuments.

The local general plan of the city of Gjirokastra must necessarily consider the boundaries and zoning protection criteria of Historical Center and Protected Area.

Article 4

Historical Center and its boundaries

The historical center is the most urban-architectural valuable part of the city of Gjirokastra. It retains various construction genres, as defensive constructions, social constructions, cult and folk housing. These constructions are associated with the urban-architectural traditional history landscape, which is part of the Historical Center.

Historical Centre consists of The Castle, the Bazaar Ensemble of the city, parts of the neighborhoods: "Old Bazaar", "Pllakë", "Hazmurat", "Teqe" "Varosh" "Meçite" "Palorto" "Dunavat I" "Dunavat II", "Manalat" and "Cfaka" and green areas, contained within them.

The boundaries of the Historical Centre are:

Article 5

Interventions allowed in the Historical Centre

In the Historical Centre are not allowed new buildings. In order to preserveurban and architectural values and the landscape of the Historical Centre, within this zone there are allowed only these interventions:

- 1. Systematic conservation interventions, restoration and maintenance according the principles of the integrated conservation.
- 2. Preservation and the inclusion of environmental values and the cultural landscape keeping unchanged the configuration of the site and the variety of traditional trees and vegetation.
- 3. The conservation of the ruins of buildings with clear masonry outline, in the Historical Center space, to prevent their further degradation. When the ruins are stored in a height of 3 m and clearly affect the Ensembles unit, within which they are included, it can be performed the reconstruction in the same volume, over the existing structure (parietal walls) with the primary objective, to preserve as much as possible the visible original features, external and internal, based on clear photographic documentation, graphic, based on typology, architectural treatment and traditional technique of construction.
- 4. In cases of natural disasters, demolitions or burning of the valuable objects of the cultural heritage, reconstruction can be performed on existing structures, according the compositional and architectural formulation of the condition before demolition, with primary objective of preserving as much as possible the visible original features, external and internal,

based on clear photographic documentation, graphic, based on typology, architectural treatment and traditional technique of construction.

5. There are prohibited the new constructions in the Historical Center except the improving of the road infrastructure, underground engineering network and reconstructions mentioned in the above points.

Article 6

Protected Area and its boundaries

The Protected Area lies around the Historical Centre. With its historical and cultural value, it completes, enriches and protects the values of the Historical Center. The Protected Area is preserved in the whole urban, architectural components and landscaping values.

As an important part of the historical landscape of the city, in the protected area there are included the green spaces of the neighborhoods under the zoning map, with the respective coordinates which is an integral part of this regulation.

The protected area is divided into two subzones according the zoning map, part of this regulation.

Subzone I -Built Areas

Subzones II-GreenAreas

The sub-zone I lies in:

- a)Part of the neighborhoods "Cfaka", "Manalat" "Dunavat"
- b) Part of neighborhoods "Palorto", "Varosh"
- c) Part of theneighborhood"11 January", "Hazmurat"
- d) Part of the neighborhood of the Workers

Sub zones II lies in:

- a) Part of the neighborhood "Cfaka"
- b) Part of the neighborhood "Partizani"
- c) Parts of the neighborhood "11 January"
- d) Part of the neighborhood "11 January"

Article 7

Interventions allowed the Protected Area

Subzones within the Protected Area will be subject to various protection measures specific to each, based on the characteristics and the current status of each area.

Interventions allowed in subzone I (letters "a", "b", "c", "d"):

In this subzone are included objects with the status "Monument of Culture" in which are allowed the following interventions:

- 1. Buildings with status "Monument of Culture", situated within this area, are subject only to interventions of maintenance, conservation and restoration.
- 2. The conservation of the ruins of buildings with clear masonry outline, in the Historical Center space, to prevent their further degradation. When the ruins are stored in a height of 3 m and clearly affect the Ensembles unit, within which they are included, it can be performed the reconstruction in the same volume, over the existing structure (parietal walls) with the primary objective to preserve as much as possible the visible original features, external and internal, based on clear photographic documentation, graphic, based on typology, architectural treatment and traditional technique of construction.
- 3. In cases of natural disasters, demolitions or burning of the valuable objects of the cultural heritage, reconstruction can be performed on existing structures, according the compositional and architectural formulation of the condition before demolition, with primary objective of preserving as much as possible the visible original features, external and internal, based on clear photographic documentation, graphic, based on typology, architectural treatment and traditional technique.

Within this area there is allowed to construct new constructions or reconstruction of existing buildings. These buildings will have restrictions on the height, volume etc., observing the following conditions:

- 1. There are allowed new constructions in empty squares, defined as such in the cadastral map.
- 2. The report of the covered parts (including shelters on doors etc.) with the surface of the construction square should not exceed 30%.
- 3. There are allowed volume extra constructions up to 10% of the surface of the existing building. The permission for volume extra construction is given only once.

- 4. The number of floors should be the same with the average of the floors of the surrounding buildings, but however no longer than 3 (three) 10 m up to the roof frame, the maximum height of the building.
- 5. The minimum distance between buildings must respect the urban planning legislation, but not less than 10 meters.
- 6. The plan metric composition and the design in the construction square must respect the typology of the buildings in that area and to be based on a close study of traditional buildings typology.
- 7. Construction characteristics should be such, in order not to create contrast with the urbanand traditional architectural composition.
- 8. It is not allowed the construction of the objects with industrial character, excluding handicraft manufactories.
- 9. Architectural Elements of the moldings, facades, ceiling finishes, surrounding walls and gates and also the colors should be in harmony with the morphological elements of traditional architecture. The slope of the roofs to be 26° 31°.

The allowed interventions on the roads and squares of the Historical Center and Protected Areaare reflected in Article 8 of this Regulation.

The allowed interventions on the green areas inside the Historical Center and Protected Areaare reflected in Article 9 of this Regulation.

Article 8

The streets and squares in the Historical Centre and Protected Area

The streets and squares of the Historic Center and Protected Area are preserved in the urban-architectural compositional formulation, as organic part of these areas.

In the Historical Center:

Restorative interventions in the road network and squares necessarily preserve materials and traditional techniques. There are allowed intervention for the improvement or implementation of new infrastructure lines over and underground, by removing original elements of the cobblestone streets and by restoring the same elements in the same position, shape and orientation according the traditional technique. Projects for these interventions are approved by KKR.

In the Protected Area:

Restorative interventions in the road network and squares necessarily preserve materials and traditional techniques. It is allowed the reconstruction of the road network and squares to improve infrastructure conditions or for the improvement or implementation of new infrastructure lines over and underground, using materials, shapes and traditional techniques. Projects for these interventions are approved by KKR.

There are allowed urban intervention furnishing by placing on the streets benches, lamps, baskets, pots of flowers or other elements of urban furnishing, provided that they are part of a retraining project area, which provides placement of elements in harmony with typology and traditional values.

There are allowed interventions for modification of the road trace, connected with needs for better use and functioning of the area within which the road is located.

In cases when the road trace in which is intervened, lies in some areas, the intervention is subject of the criteria of the area with higher protection.

Article 9

Green areas within the Historical Centreand Protected Area

These areas are part of the Historical Center and Protected Area, havepublic destination, and are elements that serve as panoramic views of the Historical Center. Existing green spaces are preserved as such.

In these areas, there is allowed intervention for rehabilitation of existing green surfaces through which can be realized urban parks. In these areas it is allowed planting of trees, organizing works, regulatory and realization of internal roads with same features as the original cobbled streets of the Historical Center, which will be used only for pedestrians.

In these areas are prohibited constructions, except the small structures with wood demountable elements, which should not cross one floor - 3.5 m, furnishing urban elements or service elements. Projects for the rehabilitation of green surfaces are developed by the Municipality of Gjirokastra or licensed entities for this category of works.

Woods and the traditional green of the roads and squares are preserved and after degradation are renewed with the same types.

Division of monuments by categories

Cultural monuments in the city of Gjirokastra, according to their historic and cultural values, are divided into two categories, monuments of first category and monuments of second category. This division by values is reflected in their storage scale, as well as in the ways and the scale of conservation and restoration intervention.

Article 11

The monuments of the first category

The monuments of the first category are the buildings with important typological and architectural values. Monuments of first category, with good authenticity degree, are preserved in the compositional, architectural, technical components and of construction materials. Courtyard, surrounding walls, the outer gate and auxiliary constructions are organic part of the monument and, as such they are subject to the same treatment.

The monuments of the first category are preserved in the Historical Center, the Protected Area and the other part of the city.

In the monuments of the first category, composition of volumes, architectural treatment of the exterior and interior views, as well as the plan metric and functional arrangement cannot change, with the exception of setting the sanitation node where it is necessary and which does not affect the values for which the monument is putted under protection.

Until the proclaiming of the protection zone of the monuments of the first category located in the Protected Area or in the other part of the City, by the responsible minister for cultural heritage, in accordance with Article 32 of Law no.9048, dated 7.4.2003, "For cultural heritage" amended, as far as it does not come in contradiction with the provisions of this regulation, there are not allowed new constructions in a distance not less than 50 m away from the surrounding walls, if any or from the wall of the object.

Treatment of existing objects within this radius to be reviewed by Commission for management of the Historical Centre, who forwards to KKR and local government case by case.

The monuments of the second category

The monuments of the second category are buildings of historical and cultural value, mainly as co-formation of urban architectural ensembles, but also as separate works.

The monuments of the second category are preserved in their volumes and their architectural treatment of the outer appearance, including materials and traditional techniques.

Courtyard, surrounding walls, the outer gate and auxiliary constructions are organic part of the monument and, as such, they are subject to the same treatment. When inside these monuments, especially in residential objects, are preserved characteristic environments, as well as wood carvings, works in plaster, pictorial decorations, valuable architectural furniture or constructive elements with special values, these are specified in the act of proclaiming and they are preserved in the place they stay.

Inside the monuments of the second category there are allowed changes of the compositional structure and the use of contemporaneous techniques, without impinge the structural integrity and the formulation of the external view.

Article 13

Objects without status as part of architectural ensembles of the Historical Center

Within the territory of the Historical Centre there are objects without protection status which do not have values to get the status of "Monument", but they are part of the architectural ensembles of the Historical Center.

In cases when these objects with their volumes and architectural formulation damage values and compositional unity of the Historical Centre are treated through rehabilitation studies, where there can be provided adjustments in accordance with the architectural ensemble, part of which they are.

In cases when these objects do not harm values and the compositional unity of the Historical Center, they are preserved in the existing volumes and can be treated in their external appearance in harmony with the architectural ensemble part of which they are. Regarding the typological and architectural characteristics, facades, ceiling finishes, constructive details, moldings, surrounding walls and gates, they should be consistent with the historical context and in harmony with the morphological elements of the traditional architecture.

The study, design and implementation of works in the Historical Centre and special monuments

- 1. Restoration projects and restoration of the cultural monuments within the Historical Center and the special monuments, which are located within the Protected Area and the other part of the city are performed by specialized state institutions and licensed entities for this purpose.
- Projects are reviewed in the Scientific Council of IMK and are approved in the National Restoration Council (KKR). The approval procedure continues under the Law on territory planning.
- 2. Implementation of the restoration works is performed by DRKK-s or by licensed restoration entities under the supervision of supervisors and testing person, appointed by IMK. For

the cultural monuments, private property, the part of expenses which are due by the owner and their repayment method, is made in accordance with the legislation in force.

- 3. Studies and reconstruction and adjustments projects referred to in paragraphs 3, 4, 5 of Article 5, where are included:
 - Restoration, conservation Systematic interventions;
 - Maintain and inclusion of environmental values and of the cultural landscape;
 - Conservation of ruins:
- Reconstruction of the existing structures in cases of natural disasters, demolitions or burnings of valuable buildings, are designed by the Cultural Monuments Institute (IMK), Regional Directorate of National Culture(DRKK Gjirokastra) or by licensed subjects in the field of restoration for this projects category. Projects are reviewed in the stage of project ideas in the Historical Center Administration Committee, which forwards for review to the Scientific Council of IMK, and are approved in the National Restoration Council (KKR). The approval procedure continues according to the law on territory planning.

- 4. Implementation of the reconstruction works for the projects referred to in paragraph 3 of this Article, is performed by the licensed entities in the field of restoration under the supervision of the supervisor and testing person, appointed by IMK and the investor.
- 5. Study and intervention projects in the road network, underground infrastructure and network engineering are developed by the Municipality of Gjirokastra or by licensed entities in the field of restoration and in the relevant category of works. Projects are developed in collaboration with the Cultural Monuments Institute (IMK), the Regional Directorate of National Culture (DRKK Gjirokastra). Projects are reviewed in the Scientific Council of IMK, and are approved in the National Restoration Council (KKR). The approval procedure continues according to the law on territory planning.
- 6. Implementation of works for intervention in the road network, underground infrastructure and network engineering is performed by DRKK-s or by licensed entities for restoration and licensed in this category of works in the field of construction, under the supervision of supervisors and testing person, appointed by the IMK and the investor.

The study, design and implementation of works in the Protected Area

- 1. Studies for the rehabilitation of the Protected Area are developed by Cultural Monuments Institute (IMK), the Regional Directorate of National Culture (DRKK Gjirokastra) in cooperation with the Municipality of Gjirokastra, or by licensed entities in the field of design for this category. Projects are reviewed in the Historical Center Administration Committee, which forwards for review to the Scientific Council of IMK, and are approved in the National Restoration Council (KKR). The approval procedure continues according to law on territory planning.
- 2. The projects of reconstruction of buildings in this area are developed by designers or licensed entities in designing project for the above categories in the construction field. These projects should be based on studies for the rehabilitation of the image of the Protected Area under paragraph 1 of this article. Projects are reviewed in the Scientific Council of IMK and are approved in the National Restoration Council (KKR). The approval procedure continues according to the law on territory planning.

- 3. The Projects for the new constructions in this area are developed by designers or by entities licensed in the construction field. Projects are developed with consultation with DRKK Gjirokastra or licensed entities for designing in the field of restoration. Projects are reviewed in the stage of project ideas in the Historical Center Administration Committee, which forwards for review to the Scientific Council of IMK, and are approved in the National Restoration Council (KKR). The approval procedure continues according to the law on territory planning.
- 4. The implementation of works and supervision for new construction after projects approving specified in paragraph 3 of this Article shall be carried out by entities licensed to this category of work in the field of construction.
- 5. Projects for road reconstruction, squares and their infrastructure, referred to in Article 8, are designed by designers or designing entities licensed in designing for the relevant project category in the field of construction. Projects are reviewed in the Scientific Council of IMK, and are approved in the National Restoration Council (KKR). The approval procedure continues according to the law on territory planning.
- 6. In case of restoration intervention in the traditional infrastructure, which is preserved insidethis area, the projects are developed by the Institute of Cultural Monuments (IMK), regional directories of national culture (DRKK) or by entities licensed in the field of restoration and in the relevant categories of works. Projects are reviewed in the Scientific Council of IMK, and are approved in the National Restoration Council (KKR). The approval procedure continues according to the law on territory planning.
- 7. Implementation of the reconstruction works in infrastructure construction is performed by licensed entities in this category of works in the construction field, under the supervision of supervisors and testing person, appointed by IMK and the investor.
- 8. Implementation of restoration works in the road network, underground infrastructure and engineering network is performed by licensed entities in restoration and by licensed in this category of works in the construction field, under the supervision of supervisors and testing person, appointed by IMK and the investor.
- 9. Social and cultural objects in the Protected Area must respect legislation for designing criteria of objects of this type. Reconstruction projects or projects for new buildings are designed by licensed subjects for this category of projects in the construction field. Projects are reviewed

in the Scientific Council of IMK, and are approved in the National Restoration Council (KKR). The approval procedure continues according to law on territory planning.

Article 16

Exploitation of monuments

Cultural monuments are exploited, according to the case, for the functions for which they were built or other functions, provided that these functions do not impair the values for which the monument is putted under protection. Exploitation of the cultural monuments, for functions different from those, for which they are raised, is done only after receiving the approval of the National Restoration Council (KKR). The exploitation contract is bound between the ministry responsible for cultural heritage and the user of monuments.

Article 17

Placing of the decorative elements and advertising

- 1. In monuments of the first and second category is not allowed the exposed placement of the elements that spoil the view and obstruct the photographing, filming and normal contemplation.
 - 2. It is not allowed to affix glasses with colors, other than the traditional type.
- 3. Placing of the advertising materials in the objects "Cultural Monument" is made in cultural and festive special cases and has temporary character.
- 4. Cultural activities in the objects "Cultural Monument" are made only in the cases when they do not endanger or affect their values.
- 5. The responsible Minister for cultural heritage grants the permission for organizing cultural events and setting of the advertising materials.

Article 18

Movement of vehicles

Within the Historical Center, in the narrow streets, cobbled streets or in important monuments as old bridges etc., is prohibited the movement of heavy vehicles, over 4 tons, except in emergency cases, and when force majeure is operating.

DRRK Gjirokastra, in cooperation with the Municipality of Gjirokastra, designs and sets the plan for ways of moving and parking of the vehicles in the entrance of the Historical Centre.

Article 19

Measures for the protection from fire of cultural monuments

Each "Cultural monument" object, in public or private ownership, within the Historical Centre of the City-Museum of Gjirokastra or outside it, must be equipped with portable fire extinguisher according to legal provisions in force. Certification of the existing electrical installations and of the protection measures from the risk of fire is made by the competent authorities in cooperation with DRKK.

Municipality of Gjirokastra, as local government authority, as city manager, should create conditions for the functioning the network of hydrants within the Historical Centre.

Studies on the identification and risk management in the Historical Center of the city of Gjirokastra are developed by the Municipality of Gjirokastra in collaboration with the Cultural Monuments Institute and the Regional Directorate of National Culture Gjirokastra and are approved in the KKR.

Article 20

Committee for Coordination of Management Plans of Historic Centers of Berat and Gjirokastra

Committee for Coordination and Administration of the Historical Center coordinates the work for implementation of this regulation and for the fulfillment of the continuous recommendations of UNESCO.

Chairman of this committee is the director of the General Directorate of the Strategic Planning of Cultural Heritage and Diversity, in the Ministry of Culture. Members of this committee are the directors of the respective DDNC-s, the respective Mayors, the director of the Institute of Cultural Monuments (IMK) and representatives of the Ministry of Culture. The composition of the Committee is established by order of the Minister of Culture.

This committee works and is convoked according the regulation, which is approved at the first meeting.


Administrative measures

- 1. Unapproved constructions by KKR inside the Historical Center are evidenced by The Regional Directorate of National Culture Gjirokastra, through continuous monitoring and administrative measures are taken against them according to the legislation in force.
- 2. From DRKK Gjirokastra, in collaboration with the Cultural Monuments Institute is drafted the action plan for returning in the previous condition of the illegal buildings, which is approved in the KKR. The decision for their treatment is taken in accordance with the legislation in force and is approved by KKR.

Article 22

Final Provisions

- 1. For all matters which are not covered and therefore are not resolved by this regulation, according competencies, they are resolved by the Cultural Monuments Institute (IMK) or the ministry responsible for cultural heritage.
- 2. For violation of this regulation there are applied sanctions according to law no. 9048, dated 07.04.2003, "On Cultural Heritage", amended.
- 3. Amendments and changes to the regulations are made with the proposal of the minister responsible for cultural heritage and approved by the Council of Ministers.
- 4. To this Regulation is attached the zoning map of the Historical Center and Protected Area of the city of Gjirokastra with the relevant geographical coordinates for the area boundaries.
- 5. It is charged DRKK Gjirokastra that, within 6 months from the publication in the Official Bulletin of this Regulation, to prepare the documentation and the list of monuments of the second category for their proclamation by the respective minister, and the list of objects without status within the Historical Centre.
 - 6. Violation of this regulation entails liability, under the laws in force.

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


