Item 10 of the Provisional Agenda : Requests for technical co-operation

The following requests for technical co-operation were examined by the Bureau at its tenth session and are submitted to the Committee for decision.

1. Bulgaria

Provision of a photogrammetric camera (P. 31 Wild to complement the P. 32 camera already supplied) and two additional items for the photometer already supplied, for the surveying of World Heritage Sites.

The Bureau recommended that the Committee grant \$ 25.000 for this project.

2. Turkey

Aid for the safeguarding of Istambul :

-	training in wood and stone conservation	\$ 12.000
-	creation of a laboratory for wood conservation	\$ 10.000
-	equipment (photogrammetric camera, theodolite, distance meter, atomic absorption spectrophotometer and accessories)	\$ 50.000

The Bureau recommended that the Committee approve the requests for \$ 12.000 for training activities in wood and stone conservation and for \$ 10.000 for the creation of a laboratory for wood conservation. The Bureau asked that the Turkish authorities supply a detailed list of the equipment requested, with clear indications on priorities. The Secretariat has received a list of equipment with priorities and is seeking further clarifications on several of the items listed. All necessary details will be provided to the Committee during the meeting.

3. Yugoslavia

Supply of equipment for the control of microclimatic conditions and for the conservation of paintings in the monuments of Ohrid \$ 20.000

The Bureau recommended that the Committee approve this request.

4. ICCROM

Contribution to organisation of the 7th International Course on the Technology of Stone Conservation to be held in Venice from 28 April to 27 June 1987, in particular, to enable fellows from developing countries to participate \$ 24.500

The Bureau recommended that the Committee allocate \$ 24.500 for this training course.
