The Sangha Tri-National (Tri-National de la Sangha or TNS), a trans-boundary forest complex, created in 2000 by the Governments of the Republic of Cameroon, Central African Republic (CAR) and Republic of Congo.

The TNS, one of the most important conservation areas in Central Africa, including the three contiguous National Parks of Lobeke (Cameroon), Dzanga-Ndoki (CAR) and Nouabale-Ndoki (Congo) and their buffer zones.

The TNS, focus of the first cross-boundary conservation trust fund in Africa, home to the first FSC-certified forestry concession in the region, and now nominated for inscription as a trans-boundary World Heritage site.
