ICOMOS Draft Workplan in connection with the World Heritage Convention 1998

Evaluation of nominations to the World Heritage List

The UNESCO World Heritage Centre has transmitted 34 cultural nominations to the World Heritage List, including one mixed property and one cultural landscape.

An ICOMOS mission will be organized for each of the nominated property apart from one case where the site has already been visited by several members of the ICOMOS Executive Committee.

The nominations will be examined by the ICOMOS Executive Committee during a three-day meeting at the end of March 1998. The ICOMOS evaluations of the properties nominated to the World Heritage List will be sent to the UNESCO World Heritage Centre together with the recommendations (in English and French) at the beginning of May 1998.

Reporting on the state of conservation of World Heritage properties

On the basis of requests made by States Parties to the World Heritage Convention and the UNESCO World Heritage Centre, ICOMOS will be available to examine the state of conservation of several World Heritage properties.

Global Strategy

ICOMOS will participate at the following meetings scheduled for 1998:

- . Workshop on Andean Cultural Landscapes, Cuzco (Peru), February;
- . Workshop on Caribbean cultural heritage in the context of the World Heritage Convention, Martinique, April;
- Conference on the Global Strategy (natural and cultural heritage), the Netherlands;
- . Meeting on cultural landscapes in Africa.

Thematic Studies

- ICOMOS will continue the studies on industrial heritage which it is carrying out in collaboration with TICCIH on the following topics:

- . World historic railways. This study will be completed in time for the World Heritage Committee meeting in December 1998;
- . Non-ferrous mining.

- The study on 20th century architecture undertaken in collaboration with DoCoMoMo will be presented during the World Heritage Committee meeting in December 1998;

- ICOMOS wishes to start a study on rock art in the context of the World Heritage Convention.

Furthermore, other thematic studies will doubtless be initiated in the course of examining the new nominations.

Dissemination of information on the Convention within the ICOMOS network

ICOMOS will continue to distribute information concerning the Convention in the form of lectures and articles to meetings of its National and International Committees and of other national and international bodies.

Administrative meetings

ICOMOS will participate in the meeting of the Advisory Bodies (ICOMOS, IUCN, ICCROM) with the UNESCO World Heritage Centre to be held on the 2nd February 1998 at UNESCO Headquarters.
