The main focus of the programme was promoting intangible heritages. As a result, volunteers worked with local residents and provide them the opportunity to express their cultures in various forms such as arts.

A concert of modern songs of Tamberna inspiration involved 5 Tammari artists from Benin that composed their songs in Tamberna languages.
