SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF STATES PARTIES TO THE CONVENTION CONCERNING THE PROTECTION OF THE WORLD CULTURAL AND NATURAL HERITAGE

<u>Item 7 of the Provisional Agenda: Elections to the World Heritage Committee</u>

1. As at the end of the 23rd session of the General Conference, the World Heritage Committee was composed of the following twenty-one States Parties:

Algeria Greece Mexico Australia Guinea Norway Brazil India Sri Lanka Bulgaria Jordan Turkey Canada Lebanon Tanzania (U.R.of) Libyan A. Jamahiriya Yemen A.R. Cyprus Germany (F.R. of) Malawi Zaire

- 2. The terms of office of the above-mentioned twenty-one members extend as follows:
- until the end of the 24th session of the General Conference of Unesco (1987):

Brazil, Cyprus, Germany (Federal Republic of), Guinea, Jordan, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Zaire;

- until the end of the 25th session of the General Conference of Unesco (1989):

Algeria, Australia, Lebanon, Malawi, Norway, Sri Lanka, Turkey;

- until the end of the 26th session of the General Conference of Unesco (1991):

Bulgaria, Canada, Greece, India, Mexico, United Republic of Tanzania, Yemen Arab Republic.

- 3. The sixth General Assembly is called upon to elect seven members to the World Heritage Committee to replace those members whose term of office expires at the end of the 24th session of the General Conference.
- 4. In this connection, it will be recalled that paragraph 5 of Article 16 of the Convention provides that "Any State Party to the Convention which is in arrears with the payment of its compulsory or voluntary contribution for the current year and the calendar year immediately preceding it shall not be eligible as a Member of the World Heritage Committee... The terms of office of any such State which is already a member of the Committee shall terminate at the time of the elections provided for in Article 8, paragraph 1 of this Convention". A statement on compulsory and voluntary contributions as at 31 August 1987 appears in document CC-87/CONF.013/2 Annex III. The General Assembly will be informed on 30 October 1987 of any compulsory or voluntary contributions received since 31 August 1987.
