Periodic Reporting – Why?

Overall Objectives:

- Enforcement of the capacities of the States Parties towards a more sustainable conservation mechanism for their World Heritage sites
- Perform necessary modifications to the World Heritage site boundaries, buffer zones, name changes, revision of criteria
- Drafting of Statements of Outstanding Universal Value (OUV)

Goal:

- The Periodic Reporting exercise will be of benefit to all concerned States Parties and site-managers as a tool for sustainable management and monitoring of their World Heritage properties.

Periodic Reporting – Why?

PR should be perceived as:

- A preventive monitoring tool
 - Ratified by all States Parties to the World Heritage Convention
 - the most comprehensive environmental convention in the world, **with** effective monitoring mechanisms
- An alarm mechanism
- A tool for identification of needs for assistance and capacity building
- An opportunity to gather Site Managers and national Focal Points
- An opportunity to strengthen regional networks between professional actors within the field
- A self-reporting tool for the States Parties, and as an instrument for « peer-review » in the region.

Periodic Reporting: Data analysis – Validity and methods

- Method for data collection:

Self evaluation through online tool

- For analytical purposes, the *reliability* and *validity* of the data and conclusions drawn from them must be considered carefully

The information provided through the questionnaires should be cross-checked and triangulated with other sources in the analysis process, such as:

-Advisory Bodies' interventions

-Other available Information at WHC (SOC reports, reactive monitoring reports, regional and sub-regional meeting reports)

-Cf. Decision **29 COM 7B**, where the COM calls for

“cross-referencing between state of conservation and periodic reports to enhance consistency in reporting mechanisms and to ensure that follow-up action is taken as necessary;”



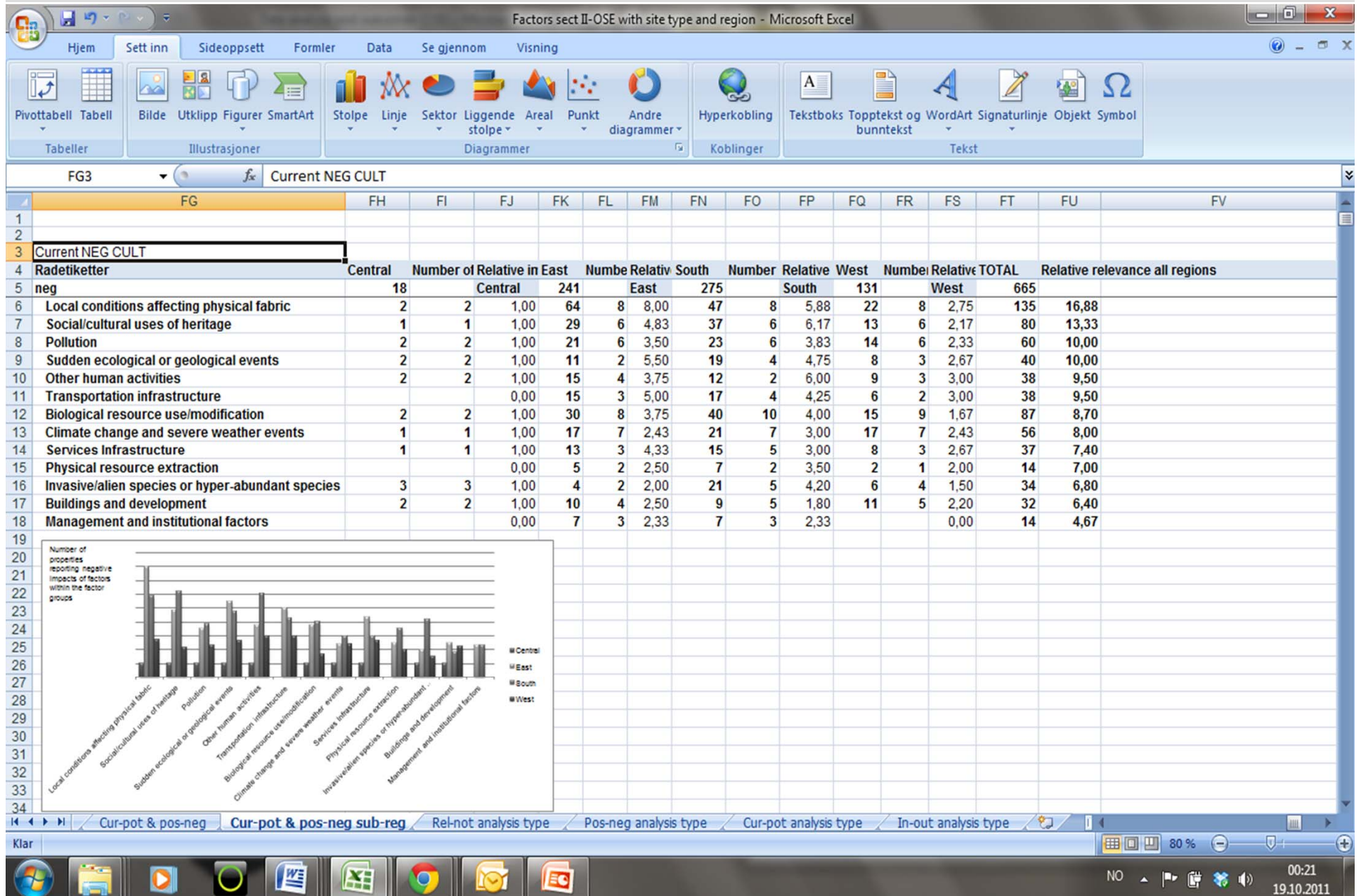

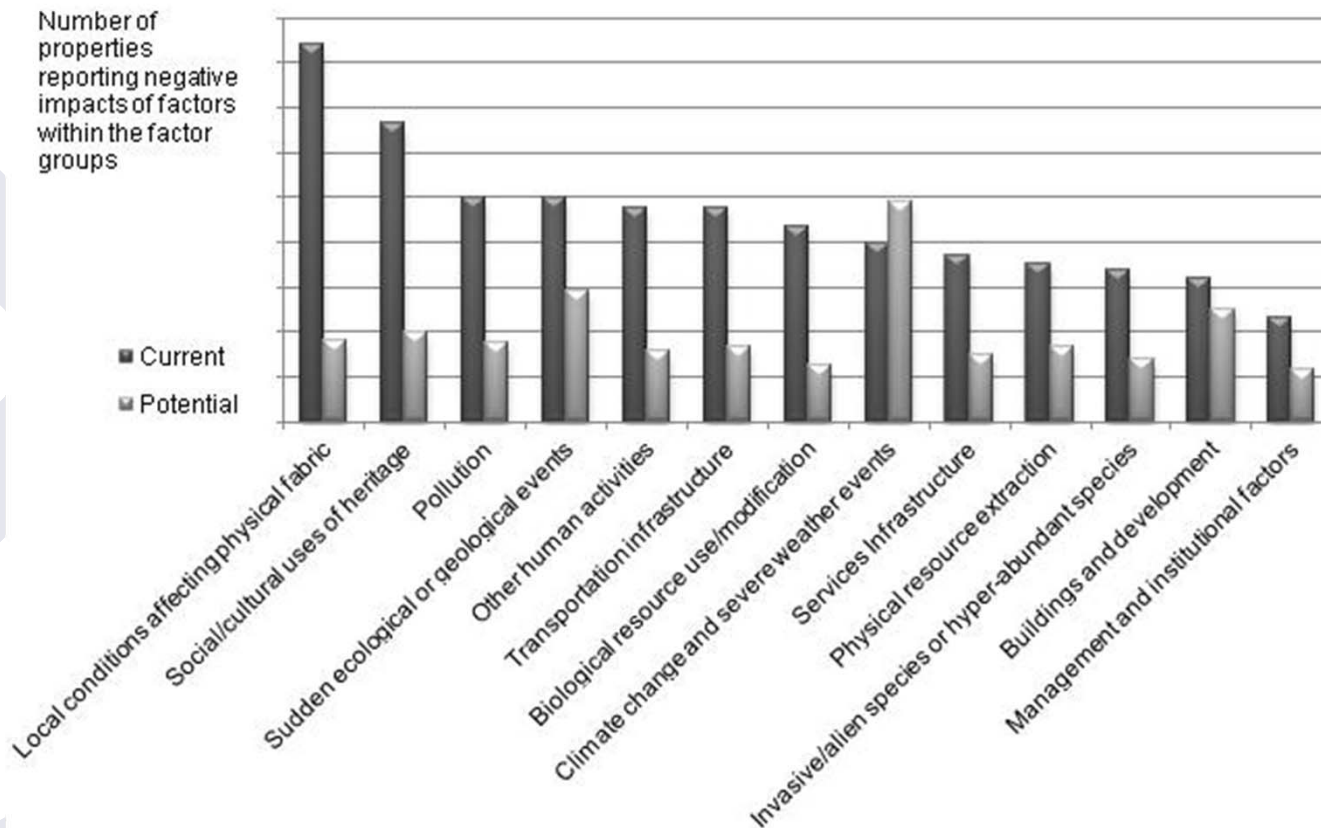

- Through statistical analysis, we created graphs showing the rather complex mass of data in a more comprehensible way:



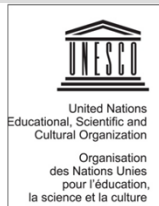
