Subject: European Periodic Reporting on the application of the World Heritage Convention and on the state of conservation of World Heritage properties: Decisions by the 30<sup>th</sup> session of the World Heritage Committee (Vilnius, Lithuania, July 2006) and Follow-up

Madam/Sir,

I have the pleasure to inform you that the European Periodic Report, which was presented to the 30<sup>th</sup> session of the World Heritage Committee in Vilnius (Lithuania) in July 2006, was well received. Please find the relevant decision of the Committee **30 COM 11A.1** enclosed as Annex I. In its decision, the World Heritage Committee requests all European States Parties to provide an official letter to the World Heritage Centre by **31 September 2006**, indicating their agreement to make the electronic database available for data-sharing with the Council of Europe and other partners as well as on the World Heritage webpage for the general public.

Furthermore, you will find as Annex II the Decision **30 COM 11A.2** concerning clarification of property limits provided by States Parties in the European Region in response to the Retrospective Inventory.

As a follow-up to the Periodic Reporting Exercise, three meetings are planned so far: for Western Europe (Paris, France, October 2006), South Eastern Europe (Thessaloniki, Greece, November 2006) and Mediterranean Europe (Madrid, Spain, in 2007). These meetings will specifically address the issues indicated in Decision **30 COM 11A.1**. The publication of the European Synthesis Report is underway for the World Heritage papers series. # 11A.1. PRESENTATION OF THE PERIODIC REPORT FOR SECTIONS I AND II OF EUROPE

### Decision 30 COM 11A.1

The World Heritage Committee,

- 1. <u>Having examined</u> Document *WHC-06/30COM/11A.1* and <u>taking note</u> of Document *WHC-06/30COM/INF.11A*,
- 2. <u>Recalling</u> Decisions **25** COM VII.25-27 and 7 EXT COM 5A.2, adopted respectively at its 25th session (Helsinki, 2001) and 7th extraordinary session (UNESCO, 2004),
- 3. <u>Expressing its sincere appreciation</u> for the considerable efforts by all 48 States Parties in Europe in submitting the Periodic Reports for Section I in 2004 and Section II in 2005,
- 4. <u>Notes</u> the successful use of an electronic tool, the development of an evaluation tool and the storage in a World Heritage Centre database of all information submitted by the States Parties;
- 5. <u>Thanks</u> the German authorities for hosting a European meeting (Berlin, Germany, 8 9 November 2005) on the results of Periodic Reporting Section I and the finalization of Section II, as well as the development of an overall Strategic Action Plan and <u>welcomes</u> the "Berlin Appeal" to enhance cooperation and support by European States Parties and European Institutions on World Heritage;
- 6. <u>Welcomes with satisfaction</u> the synthesis report of the European Region illustrating a growing co-operation among States Parties;
- 7. <u>Acknowledges and endorses</u> the Action Plan of the European synthesis report on Section I and II and the sub-regional reports and <u>requests</u> the States Parties to make an effort towards a coordinated approach for its implementation;
- 8. <u>Requests</u> States Parties to work with the World Heritage Centre and the Advisory Bodies to start implementing the Action Plan for the European Region;
- 9. <u>Further notes</u> that preparations for the follow-up to the Periodic Reporting results, including name changes, boundary changes and statements of significance have started in some European States Parties, following the Circular Letter of 23 January 2006, and <u>welcomes</u> the meetings offered by the Greek authorities in November 2006, by the French authorities in October 2006 and by the Spanish authorities in January 2007, to ensure a coordinated and systematic approach of these follow-up activities;

- 10. <u>Notes</u> the importance of management plans for the protection of World Heritage properties and that many European sites reviewed lack this tool, and <u>requests</u> States Parties to prepare management plans for those World Heritage properties that still do not have them;
- 11. <u>Recognizes</u> the need to avoid the nomination of similar types of properties and <u>encourages</u> States Parties to cooperate in harmonizing their Tentative Lists by sharing information on the sites proposed;
- 12. <u>Strongly encourages</u> the States Parties in Europe to continue the improved cooperation and <u>requests</u> all States Parties to submit any changes to names, criteria, boundaries and statements of significance in a timely fashion and in accordance with deadlines outlined in the *Operational Guidelines*;
- 13. <u>Notes also</u> that such proposals (and the similar ones made in Periodic Reports for other Regions) have considerable resource and workload implications for the Committee, the World Heritage Centre and the Advisory Bodies as well as for States Parties;
- 14. <u>Further requests</u> that all European States Parties provide an official letter to the World Heritage Centre by **31 September 2006**, indicating their agreement to make the electronic database available for data-sharing with the Council of Europe and other partners as well as on the World Heritage webpage for the general public;
- 15. <u>Requests</u> the World Heritage Centre and the Advisory Bodies to prepare a progress report on the follow-up to the European Periodic Report including time tables, budgetary implications and priorities for examination at its 31st session in 2007.
