# Purposes of Periodic Reporting?

According to Article 29 of the *Convention* and paragraphs 199 to 210 of the *Operational Guidelines*, Periodic Reporting serves the following four purposes:

1. to provide an assessment of the application of the World Heritage Convention by the State Party
2. to provide an assessment as to whether the Outstanding Universal Value of the properties is being maintained over time
3. to provide up-dated information about the properties to record their state of conservation and the changing circumstances
4. to provide a mechanism for regional co-operation and exchange of information and experiences to ensure effective long term conservation of properties

# The cycles of Periodic Reporting in Europe and North America

## First Cycle (2001-2006)

- 50 States Parties
- 275 WH properties: all those inscribed until 1998
- A division in two groups:
  - o North America
  - o Europe

## Second Cycle (2012-2015)

- 51 States Parties
- 476 WH properties: all those inscribed until 2013
- A division in two groups:
  - o Group A: NA, WE, BS
  - o Group B: CESEE, ME

# The revised questionnaire: the origins

After the first cycle of PR, the following flaws were identified in the Section II of the questionnaire:

## States Parties

- Request of data already available at the World Heritage Centre
- Difficult access to the sources of information
- Too narrative/descriptive information (time-consuming)

## World Heritage Centre

- Comparing results across regions
- Difficult to retrieve data and elaborate statistics
- Reliability of data

- **G**ood practice
- **E**fficiency

# How the revised questionnaires solve the problems identified by the World Heritage Centre in the old questionnaires

- Comparing results across regions → the same questionnaire
- Difficult to retrieve data and elaborate statistics → electronic tool
- Reliability of data → more qualitative than quantitative approach

# How the revised questionnaires solve the problems identified by States Parties in the old questionnaires

- Request of data already available at the World Heritage Centre → **pre-filling**
- Difficult access to the sources of information → **pre-filling + links**
- Too narrative/descriptive information (time-consuming) → **yes/no and multiple choice questions + shorter questionnaire**

## Pre-filling: the process

The World Heritage Centre gathers baseline data in cooperation with the States Parties concerned



The data gathered by the World Heritage Centre are used to pre-fill the Periodic Reporting questionnaires



Every cycle of Periodic Reporting, the State Party concerned checks the accuracy of those data and if needed updates them



## Pre-filling: the methodology

The methodology of pre-filling is based upon the following principles:

- Only information submitted officially by the State Party is used
- The pre-filling is made on the basis of what is available at the World Heritage Centre, not necessarily of what exists at the national level
- The pre-filling is made in English or French: the choice is based on the language of the State Party (section I) and on the language of the Nomination file (section II)
- For the section II, only data referring to the World Heritage property as inscribed are included
- For the section II, all documents mentioned in the questionnaire (map, management plan, etc.) can be downloaded

## Europe and North America

### Periodic Reporting

Every six years the States Parties of Europe and North America are invited to carry out a Periodic Reporting exercise for the World Heritage properties located in their territory in order to provide an assessment of the application of the World Heritage Convention, to facilitate the update of information and to record possible changes in the state of conservation of their properties.

World Heritage National Focal Points and Site Managers play a very important role in the Periodic Reporting exercise process. They are the ones who best know the situation, challenges, opportunities and difficulties related to the management, protection, conservation and development of the World Heritage properties for which they are responsible.

The Periodic Reporting exercise involves an online questionnaire pre-filled with relevant information from the official records. Focal Points and Site Managers are invited to complete and update this information.

#### Periodic Reporting Second Cycle (2012-2015)

The second cycle of the Periodic Reporting exercise for Europe and North America started in July 2012. Due to the high number of World Heritage properties, the exercise is conducted over three years with countries divided into two groups (A and B). The Report and Action Plan for North America will be presented to the World Heritage Committee at its 38th session in 2014, whereas the Final Report and Action Plan for Europe will be presented to the World Heritage Committee at its 39th session in 2015.

#### Access to the questionnaire

Access to the questionnaire is reserved to Focal Points of States Parties (Sections I and II), and Site Managers (Section II). However the questionnaire will be available for completion and submission to the respective groups only during the year as follows:

#### Retrospective Statements of Outstanding Universal Value

As requested by the World Heritage Committee in 2007 (Decision 31COM 11C.1), prior to the start of the second cycle, that all States Parties submit, by 1 February 2012, retrospective Statements of Outstanding Universal Value for the properties inscribed before 2007. The elaboration of Statements of Outstanding Universal Value is not only crucial for the adequate management and conservation of the properties, but is also the basis for completing Section II of the revised questionnaire. Indeed, most questions need to be answered by referring to the Statement of the Outstanding Universal Value of the property.

- filled in by the Site Manager
- then reviewed by the Focal Point
- Focal Point then submits to the World Heritage Centre
- 6 chapters

## Roles and responsibilities

- National Focal Points fill in **Section I** of the questionnaire and submit it to the World Heritage Centre.
- Site Managers fill in **Section II** of the questionnaire and inform the Focal Point once questionnaire completed.
- National Focal Points review **Section II** of the questionnaire and submit it to the World Heritage Centre.

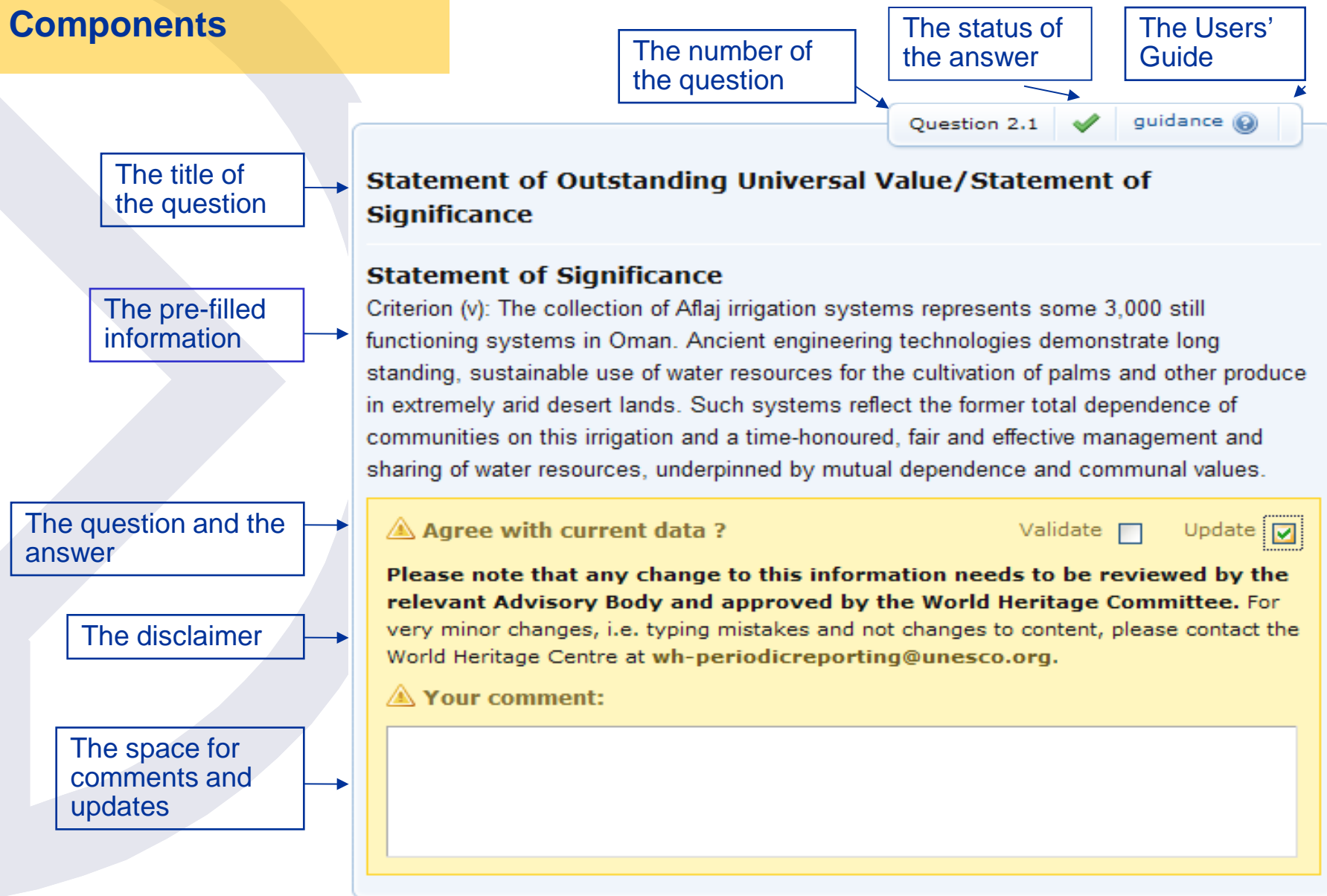

#### Focal Points:

The designated national Focal Points of the concerned States Parties have all access to the relevant questionnaire to review the questionnaire. The States Parties decide among each other who will be the one designated Focal Point that validates the questionnaire.

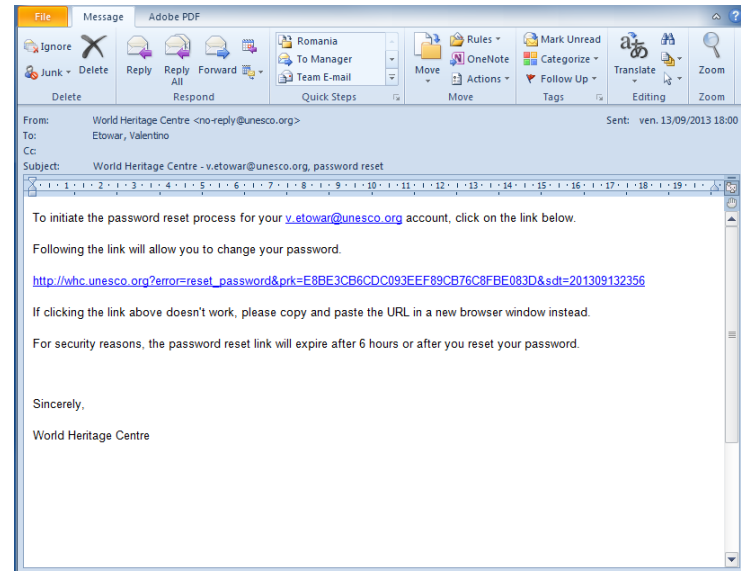

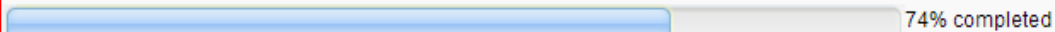


