In my capacity as President of the World Heritage Committee I would like to applaud your decision to halt the proposed saltworks at the World Heritage site of the "**Whale Sanctuary of El Vizcaino**" (Mexico).

On behalf of the World Heritage Committee, I wish to express my appreciation for the commitment of your Government to protect this unique World Heritage property for future generations.

The World Heritage Committee at its last session in Marrakesh, Morocco in December 1999 had the opportunity to review the report of the international UNESCO mission to the site, which was carried out at the kind invitation of your authorities in August 1999.
