2. Institutional and operational structure of the Centre (Governing Board, Staffing, Operational funding and premises)

The <u>Board of Trustees</u> ordinarily meets twice a year in June and December. It's composed of 5 regional members (East, West, North, Centre and Southern Africa), 3 professional members, 3 institutional members (UNESCO, African Union and South Africa as host) and 2 ex-officio members. The <u>Secretariat</u> is currently composed of 11 staff including 2 interns and 1 seconded. The premise and part of the operation are funded by the host country. Contributions from other States Parties help to consolidate operation and implement programmes. The AWHF also has an Endowment Fund which returns on investment aim to sustain its work. The AWHF's offices are located in the premises of the Development Bank of Southern Africa (DBSA).

3. Updates on the management of the Centre – particularly on meetings of the Governing Board and key decisions adopted

The 20th Board meeting was held in December 2016 in Marrakech, Morocco. The meetings among others (1) <u>Urged</u> the Secretariat to initiate concerted advocacy actions with the World Heritage Centre on the use of African expertise in processes related to the implementation of the World Heritage Convention in Africa, (2) <u>Took note</u> of the limited fund raised during the period April-October 2016 and requested the Secretariat to identify champions from the private sector who can assist the fundraising activities (3) <u>Took note</u> of the AWHF 10h Anniversary implementation report in 2016, (4) <u>Agreed</u> that the 21st Board meeting will be held in June in South Africa.
