A/ The increasingly rapid urbanization and the development of traffic system cause the influence to the buffer zone around the monuments: the crowded tourists to Hue could cause the bad affection to the capacity and life-span of historic buildings and also the people's living style in the historic city.

B/Hue monument complex 's location is heavily influenced by annual typhoons and storms. Annual floods and storms cause damage to both banks of the Perfume River, creating roof- leaking and foundation sinking for palaces, buildings. Over the last years, the Centre has made efforts in cooperation with the other organisation to minimise damages caused by disasters however, there are still difficulties regarding to budget. technique, management methods,

C/ Being an organisation in charge of preserving a huge complex of monuments in Hue, the Centre lacks a system of up-to- date equipments that could improve the efficiencies in making researches and restoration work. D/ Lack of documents necessary for the restoration research work. Most of
