2.3 - Attributes expressing the Outstanding Universal Value per criterion

Criterion (i): The monasteries at Daphni, Hosios Loukas and Nea Moni represent, with their admirable mosaics on a gold background, unique artistic achievements. On this basis each one of these indisputable masterpieces of Byzantine art could have been included on the World Heritage List on its own merits. Criterion (iv): These three monasteries are outstanding examples of a type of construction characteristic of the middle period of Byzantine religious architecture. Nea Moni illustrates the most simple expression: an octagonal church with no added spaces. Hosios Loukas and Daphni are more complex. They have a central octagonal space surrounded by a series of bays that form a square. This more elaborate structure defines a hierarchy of volumes and functions and enables the implementation of an extensive iconographic and decorative plan. It is typical of other churches, like Christianou near Kyparissia, Panaghia Likodimou in Athens or Saint Sophia in Monemvasia. The two examples included in the proposal are, along with Saint Theodorus of Mistra (included on the World Heritage List in 1989), the most representative by virtue of the perfection of their architecture, the beauty of their mosaics and paintings and their more satisfactory state of conservation.

There are no specific arrangements for this site. Delimitation of extensive boundaries of the archaeological site, instead of the 150 meters buffer zone around the monument, which was in force until 2000.

A revision of the boundaries of the archaeological site and of the buffer zone has taken place in 2009, on the basis of L.3028/02, and has been approved by the World Heritage Committee at its 33rd Session (Decision 33COM 8D). There is no management plan. The management and protection of monuments and archaeological sites in Greece is not based on an actual management plan. Greece has a system of protection, which is administered centrally by the

Ministry of Culture through its regional services. The Ministry of Culture is the competent body supervising the sites and overseeing all works carried out. As far as the safeguarding of cultural and natural heritage is concerned, there are cases where other competent bodies besides the Ministry of Culture are involved. The Ministry of Culture sets out the guidelines and the general policy for the management of the monuments and sites, which is then implemented by the competent Ephorates.

While the management of the site of Daphni is the responsibility of the 1st Ephorate of Byzantine Antiquities, there are also plans in progress for the setting up of a committee in order to assist in the management.

As regards the Monastery of Hossios Luckas, the 1st Ephorate of Byzantine Antiquities is in charge of the management of the site regarding the cultural heritage. In parallel, the monastery, being a place of cult, is managed by an Igoumenosymvoulion (board of abbots), which has its seat there.

In Nea Moni there are no plans to set up a 'steering group'. The management of the archaeological site of Nea Moni, in accordance with Law 3028/2002 «On the Protection of Antiquities and Cultural Heritage in general», is exercised by the competent Decentralized Service of the Ministry of Culture, the 3rd Ephorate of Byzantine Antiquities.' The responsibilities of the Site Manager have been added to an existing job.

The current management system is considered sufficiently effective.

Therefore, such revenues are subject to centralized administration and for that reason it is not possible to estimate their contribution to the total funding of each property. In the Monastery of Nea Moni of Chios there is accessibility for the people with disabilities for the church and some buildings of the monastery, but not for all of them.

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Also, two Braille leaflets for the refectory and the Monastery complex have been published. In the Monastery of Hosios Loukas a ramp for people with disabilities is provided.
