The level of protection of the Aeolian islands is ensured by various systems of protection and landscape planning. The institution of the National Park entails, on a superordinate level with respect to the regulations of protection at the territorial level, the operation of the main instrument, which from 1991, in implementation of article 9 of the Italian Constitution, regulates the National System of the Protected Areas in Italy and which has led to the creation of regional national parks and natural reserves that potentially cover more than 10% of the land surface of the Country: law 394/1991.

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Law No. 394 of December 6th, 1991 – otherwise known as "the Legal Framework governing Protected Areas" – has the general aim of "ensuring and promoting, in a coordinated way, the conservation and enhancement of the natural heritage of the country" identified in the "physical, geological, geomorphological and biological formations that have significant naturalistic and environmental value."

The park plan, as foreshadowed by article 12 of the law 394/1991, represents the fundamental instrument for the "protection of the natural and environment value entrusted to the Park and reflects the most recent evolutionary developments from the technical and legal perspectives of the relationship between territorial-urban and landscapeenvironmental planning in the light of the overall plan for the territory." Characterised by a high content value, in terms of planning, the plan governs the general organisation of the territory, the differentiated forms of its use, enjoyment and protection; it applies constraints on the purposes of public and private use; it defines the systems of equipment and services for the park; it defines the directions and criteria for the interventions involving the flora, fauna and natural environment in general. In particular, "the plan subdivides the territory on the basis of the different degree of protection providing" (article 12)

typical and functional areas (integral reserves, controlled areas of protection and economic protection).

In 2008 the Sicilian region and all the municipalities of the Aeolian Archipelago approved the institution of a sole management entity identified in a public Consortium among municipalities by signing a formal Protocol to rule it.
