STATE OF CONSERVATION REPORT

1. Executive Summary of the report

This is a status report of the progress of the conservation status of the Lake Turkana National Parks World Heritage Site in meeting the recommendations of Decision: 40 COM 7B.80. The State Party of Kenya recalls the Kenya-Ethiopia Joint State of Conservation report sent to the World Heritage Centre in January 2017 which addressed most of the issues raised in the aforementioned WHC decision (See Annex1).

The following therefore is just a recap of the documents sent and the most current results of the continued bilateral talks between the States Parties of Kenya and Ethiopia. The documents sent include the revised TORS for the SEA consultancy and the Environmental Impact Assessment Report of the Lake Turkana Wind Farm Project.

New reports submitted herein include the TORs for Joint Expert Panel that will oversee the SEA study exercise and the SEA bidding document for interested SEA consultants. Thus, the report covers issues discussed during the various Kenya-Ethiopia bilateral negotiations regarding conservation of Lake Turkana National Parks World Heritage Site on one hand and on the other, actions undertaken exclusively by the State Party of Kenya to implement the recommendations of IUCN Reactive Monitoring Reports of 2012 and 2015 and the WHC Decisions.

2. Actions taken to implement Decision 40 Com 7 B. 80
