Natural property inscribed on the List of World Heritage in danger since 1980

As a vast area of primary tropical forest dominated by two spectacular extinct volcanoes, Kahuzi and Biega, the park has a diverse and abundant fauna, including one of the last groups of eastern lowland (graueri) gorillas.

Project objectives:

The project aims to raise awareness among volunteers and local communities and to get them involved in heritage preservation. The project will also aim to combat deforestation through concrete actions on the field.

Project activities:

The volunteers will be involved in various conferences and trainings during which they will be able to learn more about the significance of biodiversity and the park's current situation, as well as exchanging ideas and experiences about heritage conservation with the local communities and experts. By contributing to the preservation of the park, they will also be engaged in reforestation actions on the park by constructing sheds to produce biological seeds, and planting them.
