2. Institutional and operational structure of the Centre (Governing Board, Staffing, Operational funding and premises)

The ARC-WH, based in the Kingdom of Bahrain, is an autonomous and independent legal entity at the service of the Arab States. The Arab Regional Centre for World Heritage (ARC-WH) is guided and supervised by a Governing Board which is renewed every two years. The Board meets in ordinary sessions at regular intervals, at least once per calendar year. The Governing Board is chaired by the President of Bahrain Authority for Culture and Antiquities. The other members include the following: a representative of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in the Kingdom of Bahrain, a representative of the Arab Member States to the World Heritage Committee, a representative of the Director General of UNESCO, a representative of each of the Advisory Bodies to the Committee ICOMOS, IUCN and ICCROM.

The current secretariat of ARC-WH compromises 10 permanent staff members which includes the Director, Assistant Director and Programme Specialists for both Cultural and Natural Heritage. The staff also includes specialists in external relations, fund raising and communication.

3. Updates on the management of the Centre – particularly on meetings of the Governing Board and key decisions adopted

The 7th Governing Board meeting was held on the 19th of February, 2018, in Manama, Bahrain. The main decisions of the 7th Governing board meeting included adopting the new Programme Strategy 2018-2022 which aimed to address the new challenges and issues facing both Cultural and Natural Heritage in the Arab Region. The Governing Board also adopted the Action Plan for 2018 which has been prepared and presented by the secretariat of ARC-WH. The secretariat also presented the newly launched website of the Centre.
