Background

- Decision 35 COM 12B: "a new document, 'Policy Guidelines', be developed as a means to capture the range of policies that the Committee and the General Assembly adopt".
- 2015: the Government of Australia pledged its support for the preparation and finalization of a Policy Guidelines Document.
- Scoping Study presented to the World Heritage Committee at its 40th session (Istanbul/UNESCO, 2016).



Background

- With Decision 40 COM 12, the World Heritage Committee
 - Approved the Scoping Study and the **two-phase** approach recommended
 - Renamed the document 'A Compendium of Policy of the World Heritage Convention' ('Policy Compendium')
 - Requested that a Draft Policy Compendium reviewed by an expert Working Group be examined at its 42nd session in 2018
 - Requested that stakeholders be consulted in the development process





- 11. Progress report on a Draft Policy Compendium
- The Two-Phase Approach
 - Phase One CURRENT ONE:
 - to collect existing policies and to present them to the World Heritage Committee for review
 - Phase Two NEXT ONE:
 - the draft Policy Compendium would be reviewed for consistency between individual policies and a streamlined text would be presented for approval



Collection of existing policies for presentation to the World Heritage Committee

Step I. Preparatory work and the first compilation of policies

- Scope of work: producing a draft Policy Compendium for further development
- Methodology: identifying and organising existing policies, not policy drafting



Collection of existing policies for presentation to the World Heritage Committee

Step I. Preparatory work and the first compilation of policies

- DESK STUDY:
 - Extensive research of World Heritage policy documents, World Heritage Committee Decisions, the Operational Guidelines and other key policy-related documents.
 - Case law approach: ensuring holistic approach; a case law analysis of World Heritage Committee decisions on SoCs and Nominations
 - Identification of an appropriate thematic structure



The Policy Compendium Expert Working Group

- Decision 40 COM 12
- Professionals working in the field of cultural and natural heritage, Advisory Body representatives, staff members of the World Heritage Centre
- Gender-balanced, regionally-balanced and a balance of expertise in cultural and natural heritage.
- Work carried out online and during two working meetings (December 2017 and March 2018)

- Survey developed by the World Heritage Centre in consultation with the expert Working Group

CHALLENGES

- ✓ For whom?
 - Identifying the audience & their needs
 - Tailoring the document

Primary audience: The World Heritage Committee and the States Parties

Major audience: Advisory Bodies to the *Convention*, regional offices of UNESCO, regional and local authorities, Site Managers, local communities including indigenous peoples, and other relevant stakeholders

Wider audience: Academics and others with an interest in the World Heritage Convention.

 - Convention, General Assembly, Committee

 - Do decisions always use policy wording?
 - How much to quote?
 - Need to keep to original wording
 - not creating new policies, but compiling existing ones

CHALLENGES

- ✓ What structure to adopt?
 - Chronological order
 - Based on type of document (Convention, Operational Guidelines, Declarations, ...)
 - Based on procedures (inscription, state of conservation, etc.)
 - The 5Cs

CHALLENGES

- ✓ Why the 5Cs structure?
 - Aligns with Convention Objectives
 - Widely adopted, familiar to users
- ✓ Structure 5Cs: filling the gaps
 - Inclusion of of subcategories per Objective
 - Alignment with Convention procedures (i.e. SoC, Periodic Reporting...)
 - Inclusion of General Policy chapter



CHALLENGES

- ✓ Hierarchy among policies
 - Convention, General Assembly, policy documents and declarations, Operational Guidelines, Committee decisions, case law
- ✓ Similar policies
 - Which decision to quote among several on the same topic
- ✓ Policies that diverged
 - Policies that reflected different directions on the same topic
- ✓ Cross-cutting references
 - Policies relating to different chapters of the structure



CHALLENGES

- ✓ Case law:
 - Why? To include the policies derived from Committee decisions over the years, which established clear direction for some specific issues
 - How?
 - State of conservation database: Themes and Threats
 - SOC: more than 400 decisions considered
 - Nominations: more than 200 decisions considered
 - Not detailed decisions difficult to "quote" a policy text from them



CHALLENGES

- ✓ Gaps:
 - Different number of references among categories
 - Clear key areas for the Convention, without a related decision (i.e. youth)

✓ MAKING CHOICES - Reached by consensus:

- ✓ A holistic draft Policy Compendium
 - General procedures and key issues are included
 - General overview of the Committee's work and decisions
 - Policy approach to the implementation of the Convention
 - Basic framework for next steps
