2. Institutional and operational structure of the Centre (Governing Board, Staffing, Operational funding and premises)

The Arab Regional Centre for World Heritage (ARC-WH), based in the Kingdom of Bahrain, is an autonomous and independent legal entity at the service of the Arab States. The ARC-WH is guided and supervised by a Governing Board which is renewed every two years. The Board meets in ordinary sessions at regular intervals, at least once per calendar year. The Governing Board is chaired by the President of Bahrain Authority for Culture and Antiquities H.E Sheikha Mai Bint Mohammed Al Khalifa. The other members include the following: a representative of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in the Kingdom of Bahrain, a representative of the Arab Member States to the World Heritage Committee, a representative of the Bahrain Authority for Culture and Antiquities, a representative of the Director General of UNESCO, a representative of each of the Advisory Bodies to the Committee ICOMOS, IUCN and ICCROM. The current secretariat of ARC-WH comprises 12 permanent staff members which includes the Director, Assistant Director and Programme Specialists for both Cultural and Natural Heritage and a Technical Assistant for Programmes as well as two regional officers based outside the Kingdome of Bahrain. The staff also includes Resource Development Specialist, Communication and Information Officer, Admin and Logistics Officer as well as Logistical Support Coordinator and a Finance Officer. The activities of the Centre and its running costs are mainly funded by the Kingdom of Bahrain, some of the activities are occasionally cofunded by external partners according to ARC-WH agreements on joint projects.

3. Updates on the management of the Centre – particularly on meetings of the Governing Board and key decisions adopted

The 8th Governing Board Meeting was held on the 18th of February 2019, in Manama, Bahrain. The main decisions of the 8th Governing Board Meeting included reviewing and endorsing the progress of ARC-WH in the implementation of the 2018 Action Plan adopted by the previous Governing Board Meeting. The Governing Board members commended ARC-WH for the effective implementation of the adopted programme and its multidisciplinary approach towards the enhancement of the state of conservation of World Heritage Sites in the Arab States. The Governing Board Meeting also highlighted the fruitful collaboration of ARC-WH with the Advisory Bodies including its flagship Capacity Building Programme with ICOMOS and its Tabe'a programme with IUCN as well as its cooperation with the World Heritage Centre in the implementation of the Third Cycle of the Periodic Reporting Exercise.

The Governing Board also adopted the Action Plan for 2019, which has been prepared and presented by the secretariat of ARC-WH in-line with its new mid and long-term strategy adopted at the previous Board meeting. Among its potential new collaboration, ARC-WH invited the German University in Oman to present its project for a new UNESCO chair on World Heritage sustainable tourism management to which ARC-WH could be participating in the future.
