After graduation and returning to Thailand, I worked as a wildlife biologist with the Western Forest Complex Ecosystem Management Project (WEFCOM) to map distributions of large mammals and birds. After the project ended I changed my career to teaching biology and conservation for a year in Department of Biology, Faculty of Science, Mahidol University. In October 2004 I started the work with WCS as a country program director with the opportunity to work with my colleagues in the government and universities to strengthen wildlife conservation and research in Thailand. During 2013-16 I took a full time position as a lecturer at Department of Conservation, Faculty of Forestry, Kasetsart University to focus on teaching and training next generations of wildlife and national park managers for Thailand and conduct research on wildlife and ecosystem restoration in protected areas in Western Forest Complex and other areas in Thailand. Then, I have returned to full time role of directing WCS Thailand Office for more than a year.
