Oke Idanre hill consists of high plain with spectacular valleys interspersed with inselbergs of about 3,000 ft above sea level. Its physical attributes include Owa's Palace, Shrines, Old Court, Belfry, Agbooogun footprint, thunder water (Omi Aopara), and burial mounds and grounds.

Project objectives:

Building on the previous campaigns, the project aims to build resilience and increase the capacity of young people towards heritage preservation and promotion, creating a culture of peace and mutual understanding among the global community on the topic of World Heritage.

Project activities:

The volunteers will partake in the non-formal trainings coordinated by the site manager focusing on the need to preserve and protect the World Heritage and engage in hands-on activities including the installation of garbage disposals and the construction of resting ports made of stone and wood, for the visitors. In addition, they will support the organization of the street rally and open show, and the dance dramas to promote the World Heritage among the general public.
