On the banks of the Zambezi, great cliffs overhang the river and the floodplains. The area is home to a remarkable concentration of wild animals, including elephants, buffalo, leopards and cheetahs. An important concentration of Nile crocodiles is also to be found in the area.

Project objectives:

The project aims to support the preservation of the natural ecological area of the site and provide volunteers with an opportunity to carry out practical work and awareness-raising activities for the protection and promotion of the site, along with the local communities.

Project activities:

Under the technical supervision of the site manager, the volunteers will partake in road and bridge restoration work and assist in the creation of fire guards. In addition, they will facilitate awareness-raising activities by creating and diffusing promotional material on the site through road shows with performing arts, and social media campaigns, as well as assisting in the organization of drawing competitions around the theme of heritage protection. The volunteers will have the opportunity to engage in rich intercultural exchanges through cooking, singing and dancing activities with the local community.
