Background:

East Rennell is the first and only World Heritage site in Solomon Islands since 1998. It is also the first natural site under customary land ownership and management inscribed on the World Heritage List, managed and safeguarded by people living in the four villages over generations.

East Rennell was inscribed on the List of World Heritage in Danger in 2013 due to multiple threats to the site, notably posed by commercial logging and mining. This is critically linked to the absence of sustainable livelihoods for the people in East Rennell, who are the custodians of the World Heritage site. In light of increasing impact of climate change and associate disasters affecting the communities in recent years, there is an urgent need to develop sustainable nature-based livelihoods for the local communities to strengthen their security and well-being, while ensuring the safeguarding of the World Heritage value. It will help creating an enabling environment to achieve the *Desired state of conservation for the removal of the property from the List of World Heritage in Danger* by 2025.

Purpose:

With support from the UNESCO/Netherlands Funds-in-Trust, community meetings were organized in each of the four villages in East Rennell during 28 April and 1 May 2022 to:

1) discuss existing challenges and opportunities in East Rennell, and

2) identify potential sustainable livelihood options in East Rennell.

Building on the community meetings, this stakeholder consultation dialogue aims to bring together key stakeholders, including representatives of the communities from East Rennell and those based in Honiara, line ministries, provincial government, NGOs and experts, to discuss concrete actions by respective stakeholders and through collaborative efforts towards the development of nature-based sustainable livelihoods which are compatible with the World Heritage value.
