Executive Summary of the Report

The property was inscribed on the World Heritage List in 2021 - and simultaneously inscribed on the List of World Heritage in Danger – Decision 44 COM 8C.1. State of Conservation Reports were provided in January 2022 and January 2023.

A DSOCR – Desired State of Conservation to be reached to allow the property to be removed from the List of World Heritage in Danger – was produced after a thorough consultation process between the World Heritage Centre, ICOMOS, and State Party representatives in 2022 and 2023. The DSOCR was adopted by the Committee at its extended 45th Session in 2023 – Decision 45 COM 7A.56.

The State Party is working steadily for the implementation of the DSOCR corrective measures. Notable progress has been made since 2021, the simultaneous inscription on the World Heritage List and In-danger List providing considerable impetuses. This includes establishment of a Management Committee, initiation of the procedure for the elaboration of the General Urban Plan, the ongoing revision of the Property Management Plan, improving the state of conservation of the later mining heritage (prioritising vulnerable heritage, including main churches), general enhancement of the visitor experience, repairs and presentation works for the Roman galleries of the Mining Museum, and emergency works for the main header pond.

Response to the Decision of the World Heritage Committee

While all actions developed are following the objectives of the World Heritage Committee Decision for inscription in 2021 – 44 COM 8C.1 – this SOC report is addressing the most recent Decision of the World Heritage Committee – 45 COM 7A.56 – for the approval of the DSOCR.

All actions in response to the recommendations of the World Heritage Committee are timetabled, together with responsibilities and suggested indicators, as detailed in the documents submitted to the Centre and the Advisory Body during the consultation process. Such actions were also included as main priorities in the ongoing revision of the Property Management Plan.

The following table presents the main developments in the implementation of the corrective measures, as they were stipulated in the Decision, paragraph by paragraph:

Other current conservation issues identified by the State Party which may have an impact on the property's Outstanding Universal Value

There are state of conservation issues in terms of 18th- and 19th-century elements within the property – including important houses, churches, and header ponds. These, while of a much later phase and not directly attributed to OUV, are nonetheless important in the presentation of the continuity of the property's wider mining heritage. They also have proven potential to add to the visitor experience and especially contribute to the wellbeing of the local community. All were thoroughly presented in the last SOC report in February 2023, and we are now updating the information as follows:

• the Ministry of Culture, through the National Institute of Heritage, is funding conservation works on built heritage, within its two main funding instruments: the National Restoration Programme (PNR approx. 2.2 million EUR), and the Historic Monuments Stamp Duty programme (TMI approx. 280,000 EUR).

There are two complex ongoing conservation and restoration projects for two of the most representative houses in the property area which are being finalized within PNR (estimated reception autumn 2024 – spring 2025, depending on the weather conditions) while 13 maintenance conservation and restoration works and design implemented within TMI – churches, houses and also repairs and presentation works for the Roman galleries of the Mining Museum – were already completed in 2022-2023 following a call for projects launched immediately after inscription, in October 2021.

- Repairs and conservation works for 8 historic buildings, financed by the Ministry of European Investments and Projects, through the National Resilience and Recovery Plan started in 2023 and are ongoing with a progress of 10 to 40% of the total works, depending to each particular situation. The buildings are owned by local administration and churches, and the budget for each building is set to max. 65,000 EUR, totalling an approx. 500,000 EUR for the entire program.
- There are other heritage interventions, carried out by professional and/or local NGOs (in progress) as part of a larger community program ('Adopt a House') financed both from private donations and grants offered by The Administration of the National Cultural Fund (AFCN-MC) and the Romanian Order of Architects through the architectural stamp duty (total campaign budget of approx. 75,000 EUR in the past 2 years; pending approvals for further similar grants).
- The emergency intervention for the access roads and assistance to the Emergency Situations Department delivered by the Municipality of Rosia Montană in response to the risk situation occurred at the Tăul Mare header pond in October 2022, resulted in a secure situation that now allows the time needed for a more thorough technical assessment and a future durable intervention now under preparation. The Municipality of Rosia Montană continued improvements for road infrastructure to ensure access to the header pond (approx. 90,000 EUR) and made the budget proposals for the necessary studies and technical proposals for a more complex intervention. This will ensure the safety and the conservation of the entire ensemble of the historic header pond, based on the National Institute of Heritage professional assistance.
- Road infrastructure improvements financed through the PNDL National Local Development Programme and co-financed by the Roşia Montană Municipality are approved by the Ministry of Culture. These have special provisions for archaeological remains and landscape authenticity protection. Through Local Council Decision such measures are to be initiated in 2024. The project also covers historic roads in the World Heritage property and was developed with the National Institute of Heritage assistance.
- As a result of the recent operationalization of the Management Committee including a strong scientific unit and the ongoing revision of the Property Management Plan, the state of conservation of all attributes, and in particular that of Roman archaeology as key attributes, is to be reassessed and conservation priorities are to be established accordingly in the following period.

None. This topic is going to be addressed within the future Urban Regulations – the General Urban Plan – as well as the Property Management Plan. Provisions regarding the use of Heritage Impact Assessment will be introduced in order to control interventions with potential impact upon the OUV.
