**THE SITE** - The Sukur Cultural Landscape, with the Palace of the Hidi (Chief) on a hill elevated above the villages on the plains, the terraced fields and their sacred symbols, and the extensive remains of a former flourishing iron industry, is a remarkably intact physical expression of a society and its spiritual and material culture. It graphically illustrates a form of land-use that marks a critical stage in human settlement and its relationship with its environment and has survived unchanged for many centuries, and continues to do so at a period when this form of traditional human settlement is under threat in many parts of the world.

**OBJECTIVES** - The project aims at raising awareness of the site's significance, transmitting traditional skills to youth, fostering collaboration among different stakeholders, strengthening cultural and environmental resilience, promoting economic self-sufficiency, providing research materials, and advocating for gender equality.

**ACTIVITIES** - The twelve-day camp will focus on addressing traditional system needs, including architecture, crafts, and restoration projects. Volunteers will study Sukur vernacular architecture, particularly the construction of circular huts with termite-resistant foundations. They will also revive traditional iron works and handicrafts, working with local guilds. These activities aim to enhance global awareness and market Sukur products internationally, benefiting the local ecotourism economy.
