Earliest 16th-Century Monasteries on the Slopes of Popocatepetl , Mexico

Cultural property inscribed on the World Heritage List (1994)

PROJECT DATES

28 July - 10 August 2024

THE SITE - The Earliest 16th-Century Monasteries on the Slopes of Popocatepetl is a serial property with 15 component parts located in the states of Morelos, Puebla and Tlaxcala in Mexico, built as part of the evangelisation and colonisation of the northern territories of Mexico. They are in an excellent state of conservation and are good examples of the architectural style adopted by the first missionaries – Franciscans, Dominicans and Augustinians – who converted the indigenous populations to Christianity in the early 16th century.

OBJECTIVES - The project aims at raising awareness among all citizens about the importance to preserve the World Heritage sites, demonstrate the value of international volunteering as a development tool, inspire young people to follow the restoration career and to generate strategic partnerships with international, national and regional stakeholders.

ACTIVITIES - Volunteers will participate in awareness-raising actions and promote the World Heritage Education Program and its activities in local schools and surrounding communities. They will also learn and practice traditional restoration techniques, which they will apply to the enhancement of the cistern as well as the partial cleaning of the perimeter wall of the former convent and the orchard inside the monastery of Huejotzingo.
