#### **Governing Board**

- The Centre is guided and overseen by a Governing Board, which is renewed every two years and is composed of:
  - a) Administrator, the Korea Heritage Service(KHS), the Republic of Korea(ROK);
  - b) Three representatives of the Government;
    - Director-General, Heritage Promotion Bureau, KHS
    - Director-General, Public Cultural Diplomacy Bureau, Ministry of Foreign Affairs
    - Director-General, Culture Policy Bureau, Ministry of Culture, Sports and Tourism
  - c) One representative of the Korean National Commission for UNESCO;
  - d) Director-General, WHIPIC
  - e) Director-General, Sports and Tourism Bureau of Sejong City, ROK
  - f) Up to five representatives from UNESCO regional groups of Member States;
    - Chairman of African World Heritage Fund as a representative of Africa
  - g) One representative of the Director-General of UNESCO; and

- h) One representative from each of the Advisory Bodies to the World Heritage Committee
- The Director of the Centre participates in the Governing Board as a non-voting member
- The Governing Board meets in ordinary session at regular intervals, at least once every calendar year; it meets in extraordinary session if convened by its Chairperson, either on his/her own initiative or at the request of the Director-General of UNESCO or of a simple majority of its members

#### **Executive Committee**

- In order to ensure the effective running of the Centre between sessions, the Governing Board may delegate to a standing Executive Committee composed of six members in the Republic of Korea
- The Executive Committee meets at least twice a year and is responsible for ensuring daily management and monitoring the implementation of programmes and the annual work plan of the Centre approved by the Governing Board
