Executive summary

The state Party of Kenya through the National Museums of Kenya (NMK) encountered a major setback in the Land acquisition process after it was realized the previously demarcated boundaries were erroneously done and overlapped with the adjacent parcels. The family in question hadn't carried out land succession as well on the parcel in question making it difficult for government to commence the payment process, the National museums of Kenya is consulting further to ensure an amicable solution is reached.

The National Museums of Kenya has continued to ensure that all projects that were scheduled to be undertaken at the property were subjected to an environmental impact assessment, heritage impact assessment and archaeological surveys.
