CONVENTION CONCERNING THE PROTECTION OF THE WORLD CULTURAL AND NATURAL HERITAGE

World Heritage Committee

Paris, 13-17 December 1982

Item 7 of the provisional agenda: Nominations to the World Heritage List and to the List of World Heritage in Danger

- 1. At its sixth session the Bureau of the World Heritage Committee examined 33 nominations to the World Heritage List, 32 of which were received during 1981 and one during 1979. This latter, a nomination from Mali for the National Park of the Baoulé Loop, had been deferred pending additional documentation.
- 2. After examining each nomination the Bureau recommended to the Committee the inscription of 24 of these properties which are listed in section A below.
- 3. The Bureau requested that certain nominations be completed or revised by the States Parties concerned and that supplementary information be sent to the Secretariat as soon as possible. Each reply received by 31 October 1982 was transmitted to the competent non-governmental organization and is mentioned in section A following the résumés of the Bureau's comments on the property concerned. The complementary information which has been received will be made available to the members of the Committee during its sixth session.
- 4. The Bureau recommended that the properties listed below in section B should not be inscribed on the World Heritage List. It also recommended not to inscribe the church of St Michael, Hildesheim on the List; however the Federal Republic of Germany stated their intention of presenting a revised dossier for this property and asked that this nomination be examined at the seventh session of the Committee in 1983.
- 5. The Bureau decided to defer examination of the following nominations pending additional information or safeguarding measures for these properties: Sidi Bou Mediène (Algeria), National Park of the Baoulé Loop (Mali), Sinharaja Forest Reserve (Sri Lanka), Indus Dolphin Reserve (Pakistan).

Nomination to the List of World Heritage in Danger

- 6. On the proposal of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan, the Bureau examined the request for the inclusion of the "Old City of Jerusalem and its Walls" in the List of World Heritage in Danger.
- 7. Several members of the Bureau considered that the "Old City of Jerusalem and its Walls", which is a property inscribed on the World Heritage List, corresponds to the situation referred to in Article 11, paragraph 4, of the Convention and that it was therefore appropriate to recommend that the Committee inscribe it on the List of World Heritage in Danger.
- 8. Other members considered that the Bureau did not have at its disposal all the information which could enable it to formulate a recommendation.
- 9. Under these conditions, since a consensus could not be reached in the Bureau on this nomination, it will be for the Committee, at its sixth session, to take in this respect the decision which in any case has to be taken by the Committee.
- 10. The Bureau recommended that the proposal be accompanied by an urban development plan for Jerusalem.

11. The Bureau also recommended:

- (a) that ICOMOS and IUCN, in collaboration with ICCROM, if necessary, work out draft "Guidelines for the implementation of the World Heritage Convention with respect to the inclusion of properties in the List of World Heritage in Danger";
- (b) that ICOMOS continue to assemble information concerning the nomination relating to the Old City of Jerusalem and its Walls, with a view to presenting authoritative and completely up-to-date advice to the Committee, benefitting, if possible, from experts' observations.
- 12. As a follow-up to the Bureau's recommendations, ICOMOS held a meeting of experts (1-2 October 1982) to draft proposed criteria for inscription of cultural properties on the List of World Heritage in Danger, as well as suggestions concerning a procedure and time schedule which could be adopted by the Committee for processing nominations to this List. ICOMOS sent the conclusions of this consultation to the members of the World Heritage Committee. IUCN also convened a working group in order to draft proposed criteria for the inscription of natural properties on the list of World Heritage in Danger. This working group met in conjunction with the World National Parks Congress which was held in Bali (Indonesia) from 11 to 22 October 1982. IUCN has undertaken the task of elaborating consolidated criteria taking into account the findings of the ICOMOS and IUCN working groups.
- 13. In addition, ICOMOS has informed the Secretariat that they are endeavouring to assemble all the information needed to formulate an opinion concerning the request for inclusion of the "Old City of Jerusalem and its Walls" in the List of World Heritage in Danger.
