A. Requests received since 1 March 1985

Bulgaria

Provision of a photogrammetric camera (P.31 Wild to complement the P.32 camera already supplied) and two additional items for the photometer already supplied, for the surveying of World heritage sites.

- P.31 Wild camera (including accessories)	\$ 45,000
- two additional items for the photometer	\$ 5,000

Malawi (request n° 289.1)

Purchase of a boat, radios and tents to strengthen protection of Lake Malawi National Park.

Turkey (request n° 356.1)

Aid for the safeguarding of Istanbul :

- training in wood and stone conservation	\$ 12,000
- creation of a laboratory for wood conservation	\$ 10,000
- equipment (photogrammetric equipment, theodolite, distomate)	\$ 50,000

N.B. The request also included assistance amounting to \$ 12,000 for the preparation of an exhibition but this type of assistance is not foreseen under the Convention.

Yugoslavia (request n° 99.1)

Supply of equipment for the control of microclimatic conditions and for the conservation of paintings in the monuments of Ohrid :

B. Request for technical cooperation for Garamba National Park (Zaire),
inscribed on the List of World Heritage in Danger

It is recalled that at its ninth session, the Committee approved a request for US\$ 20,000 under "Emergency assistance" for Garamba National Park. It furthermore authorized the Bureau to approve an additional amount of US\$ 20,000 under technical cooperation for this property subject to the receipt of an appropriate request. On 28 May 1986, the Zairian Authorities submitted such a request for the purchase of equipment up to an amount of US\$ 20,000 for the continuation of this project.
