Requests received since the tenth ordinary session of the World Heritage Committee (24-28 November 1986)

The Secretariat has received the following technical cooperation requests from the People's Republic of China and Yugoslavia:

## People's Republic of China: 1)

- a) Purchase of necessary equipment and conduct of geological research in Jixian/Tianjian area (site nominated for inscription in 1986 and is being presently evaluated by IUCN and ICOMOS) US\$30,000
- b) Training of Chinese specialists in management of natural heritage, through visits to institutions in foreign countries and through seminars/workshops organized with help of consultants, in protected areas in China for the period 1988-1990. This request has been submitted to IUCN for review.
- (local and international) for c) Travel costs scientists carrying out research on
