B. Training

3. SENEGAL/FRANCOPHONE AFRICAN STATES PARTIES

Background: Training for individual specialists from francophone African countries is normally carried out at the School for Wildlife Specialists at Garoua (Cameroon). Regional training workshops have been hosted in the past by Zaire. This is the first request from Senegal for hosting a regional training workshop.

Description of the Project: The Department of National Parks and Ministry of Nature Protection in Senegal have submitted a proposal for organizing a "Regional Training Workshop on Protected Areas in Africa" for francophone African States Parties during 30 October to 17 November 1989, in Dakar and Saint-Louis (Senegal). Lectures and presentations as well as field exercises are to be incorporated as part of the course. Traineeparticipants from 14 States Parties are to be invited to attend the workshop.

Amount requested: A total sum of \$31,548 is requested to cover international air-fare for 14 trainees and 5 resource persons (\$9,304), local allowances and per-diem for trainees and resource persons for 3 nights in Dakar and 19 nights in St. Louis (\$17,744), local operational costs (\$1,200), honoraria and other payments for local services (\$1,300), preparation of proceedings (\$1,000) and miscellaneous costs (\$1,000). The organization and conduct of the workshop will be coordinated through the regional Unesco office in Dakar (Senegal). An undetermined amount of local counterpart contribution will be available to cover local organizational expenses and costs of local travel and field exercises.

Action by the Bureau: The Bureau is requested to consider approving \$30,000 for the conduct of this regional training workshop.
