## 2. Proposal to remove a property from the List of World Heritage in Danger

<u>NGORONGORO CONSERVATION AREA</u>: This site was inscribed on the List of World Heritage in Danger in 1984 at the 8th Ordinary Session of the World Heritage Committee in Buenos Aires, Argentina, since the management capacity of this site had seriously deteriorated and jeopardized the natural integrity. Several projects, supported by contributions totalling over \$100,000 from the World Heritage Fund, have improved the status of conservation of this site. As requested by the World Heritage Committee at its thirteenth session in December 1988 in Brasilia, the Tanzanian authorities have asked that this site be removed from the List of World Heritage in Danger.
