<u>Item 15 of the Provisional Agenda</u>: Report on the execution of the Budget 2004-2005 and follow-up to the recommendations concerning the administrative and financial issues of the Audit of the World Heritage Centre undertaken in 1997

#### **SUMMARY**

In accordance with Article 4.1 of the *Financial Regulations* for the World Heritage Fund, the resources of the Fund can be used only for activities defined by the World Heritage Committee. In this document, the World Heritage Centre presents the accounts of the World Heritage Fund for 2004-2005 and the situation concerning the Mandatory and Voluntary Contributions to the World Heritage Fund established by the Comptroller as at 31 March 2005, as well as the present state of implementation of the 2004-2005 Budget at the same date (for all funding sources) according to the modalities contained in Decision **28 COM 11**.

#### I. World Heritage Centre Budget

# A. STATE OF IMPLEMENTATION OF THE 2004-2005 BUDGET OF THE WORLD HERITAGE FUND AS AT 31 MARCH 2005

- 1. The Committee, by its Decision **28 COM 11**, paragraph 4, requested the World Heritage Centre to present "at its 29th session, the entire budget of the Centre with the provisional budget statement for 2004-2005 as reproduced in Annex III of Document *WHC-04/28.COM/11* featuring:
  - a) arrears of States Parties, including those which have opted for voluntary contributions,
  - b) execution rates,
  - c) all of the extra budgetary funds, including extra budgetary funds for World Heritage managed by other sectors of UNESCO,
  - d) Resources of the Funds in Trust Operating Costs Account (FITOCA),
  - e) Human resources."
- 2. In this document, the World Heritage Centre presents, in **Annex I**, a table giving the total budget for 2004-2005 including all the sources, i.e. World Heritage Fund, extra budgetary funds, Regular Programme and Regular Programme Special Account.
- 3. For the correct interpretation of the different implementation percentages, it must be recalled that the duration of the extra budgetary fund is linked to the agreement with the funder, that the World Heritage Fund and the Regular Programme have a two-year exercise, and the Regular Programme Special Account a four-year exercise (2004-2007).
- 4. Moreover, the nature and the work plans of extra budgetary funds necessarily correspond to the structure of the budget by Main Line of Action, but rather to a result desired by the donor. An important difficulty encountered by the Centre was to reconcile the items of expenditure of certain extra budgetary projects with those of the budgetary structure. There were also cases where extra budgetary projects corresponded to two or several items of expenditure in the budgetary structure. In these cases, the Centre decided to inscribe them under the heading that represented the highest percentage. To remedy this difficulty and for a clearer reading of the information, the Centre presents in Annex I bis a table with the complete list of projects financed from extra budgetary resources managed by the Centre, with all useful information for the Committee as requested in paragraph 5 of Decision 28 **COM 11.**

- 5. **Annex II** presents the World Heritage Financial Statement as well as the statement of the contributions of the States Parties prepared by the Division of the Comptroller (DCO) as at 31 March 2005.
- 6. **Annex III** presents a table of all extra budgetary funds affected to World Heritage, managed by other Divisions or Sectors. It differs from that presented in **Annex I bis**. Indeed, the Centre cannot give the details the funds managed by the other sectors. As concerns those funds, it should be noted that the Central Services of UNESCO, alone entitled to produce financial statements, do not give this type of information because it is necessary to cross reference several criteria of which certain are not included in their data base, such as the identification of a site inscribed on the World Heritage List. The Centre has established this table with the help of information found in the financial system in order to conform with the wishes of the Committee. However, it is necessary to draw attention to the fact that it is not official UNESCO information, which can only be provided only by DCO and must be communicated by the Division of Extra Budgetary Funding Sources (ERC).
- 7. As concerns resources stemming from the Funds in Trust Operating Costs Account (FITOCA), it is necessary to recall that it is the Director-General of UNESCO who decides on its affectation. As at 31 March 2005, the resources in this account were US\$ 545,946, of which US\$ 239,704 were affected to the World Heritage Centre. This amount is shown in the table in **Annex I**, item 2.5.3: "Staff (permanent or temporary) under FITOCA".
- 8. **Annex IV** comprises a table with the human resources of the World Heritage Centre, including the personnel on fixed posts, temporary staff and assistance and associate experts in the current biennium. It should be noted that the number of fixed posts of the Centre is insufficient in regard to the numerous tasks assigned to it, which require engaging temporary assistance.
- B. EXTERNAL AUDIT ON ADMINISTRATIVE AND FINANCIAL ISSUES (carried out in 1997 by the External Auditor, and followed-up by IOS (Internal Oversight Service) in 2005)
- 9. By Decision **28 COM 11**, paragraph 7, the Committee requested the Centre "to present, at its 29th session, a report on the follow up to the recommendations of the 1997 external audit of the World Heritage Centre on administrative and financial issues (*WHC-98/CONF.201/INF.5*) and any other recommendations, and to examine jointly with the External Auditor the recommendations that had not been applied and to ensure the implementation of those which were still pertinent". The Centre presents, in the form of an information Document (*WHC-05/29.COM/INF.15*), the report of IOS (responsible for auditing services, evaluations and relations with the External Auditor). IOS carried out an audit in February/March 2005 and in May 2005. The audit covered the administrative and financial matters of the Centre, not only with regard to the recommendations of the External Auditor in 1997 but also according to a larger framework. IOS formulated recommendations which the Centre, in accordance with its commitment, implemented without delay.

#### **<u>Draft Decision</u>**: 29 COM 15.1

The World Heritage Committee,

- 1. Having examined Document WHC-05/29.COM/15,
- 2. <u>Notes</u> the state of implementation of the 2004-2005 budget, the current situation of the reserves and contributions as at 31 March 2005;
- 3. Also notes the conclusions and the recommendations of IOS and the External Auditor;
- 4. <u>Requests</u> the World Heritage Centre to present, at the next session of the Committee, a Document on the state of implementation of the 2006-2007 budget and the follow-up to the recommendations of IOS and of the External Auditor;

#### **Draft Decision: 29 COM 15.2**

The World Heritage Committee,

- 1. <u>Urges</u> States Parties to pay their arrears to the World Heritage Fund;
- 2. <u>Invites</u> the Director-General to encourage States Parties to make voluntary donations to the World Heritage Fund in addition to their contributions.
