## CONVENTION CONCERNING THE PROTECTION OF THE WORLD CULTURAL AND NATURAL HERITAGE

## Bureau of the World Heritage Committee Sixteenth Session

## UNESCO Headquarters, 6-10 July 1992 Room XVI

**Item 11 of the Provisional Agenda:** Promotional activities for the celebration of the twentieth anniversary of the World Heritage Convention.

It is recalled that the Committee, at its fourteenth session held in Banff, Canada, in December 1990, decided that the twentieth anniversary of the adoption of the World Heritage Convention by the General Conference of UNESCO should be the object of a specific celebration and entrusted the Secretariat with the organization of a number of activities both at UNESCO Headquarters and elsewhere.

The activities at UNESCO Headquarters should include the presentation of a public exhibition on World Heritage and the organization of national days or weeks, in collaboration with the permanent delegations of the countries concerned. With regard to activities outside Headquarters, their purpose is to promote national initiatives for the celebration of this twentieth anniversary and to organize five regional seminars, giving broad access to the press, to better publicize the objectives of the Convention.

The present document is a summary on the progress of these different activities.

# I. Activities at UNESCO Headquarters

These activities will be held from 8 July to 8 October and will include, in addition to the main exhibition to the presented in the Salle des Pas Perdus and Hall Miro ot Fontenoy Building of UNESCO, twenty-eight itinerant exhibit under the responsibility of the permanent delegations in the framework of the national days of the States Parties. Moreover, conferences and film projections from eighteen countries will be organized, as well as eighteen evening performances of music and dances. The detailed programme of these events is included in the appendix to this document.

A poster commemorating the twentieth anniversary was kindly produced by a French artist. It will be sold for the benefit of the Fund throughout the duration of the exhibition.

A press conference will be given by the Director-General on 8 July at 17.00h. The presence of the members of the Bureau at this conference is foreseen to enable journalists to benefit from the experience of representatives from different regions of the world.

The official inauguration of all these events will take place on 8 July at 18.30 in the presence of the Director-General and the membres of the Bureau. It will be followed by a gala evening to which the members of the Bureau are cordially invited.

## **II. ACTIVITIES OUTSIDE HEADQUARTERS**

### A. National initiatives

The Canadian Commission for UNESCO has organized its 34th General Assembly on the theme of world heritage, within the context of the twentieth anniversary and in the presence of a representative of the Director-General of UNESCO. The participants discussed the application of the Convention and future perspectives, the Canadian experience of both cultural and natural sites and different questions linked to the preservation and enhancement of world heritage. Furthermore, films on World Heritage sites co-produced by the Transtel Company and UNESCO, were shown.

In France, various events on World Heritage sites are organized in Reims, Versailles and Amiens. Moreover, the preparation of a special issue of the publication "Monuments Historiques" on world heritage is being prepared. Finally, an exhibition of old photographs on French World Heritage sites, will be presented at the Hotel Sully, in Paris, from July to September.

A national seminar was organized in Jakarta, Indonesia, on 13-14 April, to raise with the different national and local authorities issues pertaining to the protection and enhancement of cultural and natural heritage. On this occasion, an exhibition was presented at the National Museum 'L<sub>iner</sub> P

for a period of 10 days, with the help of equipment provid by the Secretariat.

Seychelles will organize different activities for the promotion of the Convention and the sites of Aldabra and the May Valley during the course of a national week in October.

Finally, a seminar on the application of the Convention with regard to natural sites in Latin America is to be held in Xalapa, Mexico, during the second week of July. It will bring together a number of experts from the region to discuss the elements presented in a document which is under preparation.

## B. Regional Seminars

The first of these seminars was held in Jakarta from 15-18 April.

Experts from the following countries participated: Australia, Sri Lanka, New Zealand, Malaysia, Thailand, Vietnam, Papua New Guinea, Indonesia, Philippines and India. main questions under discussion concerned The the implementation of the Convention at the national level, ways and means to promote the Convention, development and heritage concepts, particularly the question of tourism. The participants underlined the need for the Convention to place more emphasis on site management. Seminar recommended the exchange of To this end, the specialists and information within the region, and Australia offered their support to set up a regional data base of experts available in that region.

Contacts with the press were ensured by a representative from the UNESCO press service (Office of Public Information).

For Francophone Africa, a seminar will be held in Dakar, at the invitation of the Senegalese authorities. The issue of management of natural world heritage sites confronted with development problems will be raised with the representatives of several countries from the region who will present case studies on Aïr et Ténéré (Niger) Taï (Côte d'Ivoire), Mt Nimba (Guinea and Côte d'Ivoire) and Niokolo-Koba National park (Senegal). This seminar is planned for September.

The Secretariat is also planning to organize, at the end of the year, a seminar in East Africa on the same issue for the benefit of Anglophone Africa (in Kenya or Tanzania). The seminar on the management of medinas, foreseen in Fez, (Morocco), is under preparation and will be held during the first half of November.

Lastly, the seminar foreseen in Quito (Ecuador), will also be held in November: a small group of experts from the region will meet and present case studies on the state of several cities in Latin America inscribed on the World Heritage List. Wide regional and international press coverage is expected.

#### III. ACTIVITIES NOT CONCERNING THE TWENTIETH ANNIVERSARY

Since the last session of the Committee, the Secretariat has completed a number of planned promotion activities. A summary progress report on these activities is presented below.

## A. Data Sheets on World Heritage sites

An agreement has been concluded with the publisher Larousse-Laffont for the production and mail-order sale of the illustrated data sheets on World Heritage sites. This project is not financially supported by the World Heritage Fund, but the Fund is to receive a 3% share of the sales income. Several hundred thousand data sheets are to be distributed and negotiations are underway for production of these sheets in other languages. The first data sheets have been completed and will be presented to the members of the Bureau for their information.

#### B. Brochure on World Heritage

The brochure update has been completed, as each year, and the new version has been widely distributed. Moreover, the brochure will be sold to visitors at the exhibition to be held at UNESCO Headquarters, for the benefit of the Fund.

### C. Computer programme

A prototype of the video disk (on a CD-Rom support) on World Heritage sites, has been made for fifty sites. It is recalled that the object is, for each World Heritage site to store text and images briefly describing the site. The prototype should be ready to allow for a demonstration of its functioning to the members of the Bureau.

# D. Elaboration of guidelines on the management of tourism in World Heritage sites

The members of the Bureau will recall that the Committee, at is last session, undertook the elaboration of guidelines on the management of tourism in World Heritage sites. This project is implemented jointly by the Secretariat, the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) and the World Tourism Organization (WTO), with a tripartite financing arrangement. The three organizations have decided to start with the natural and mixed sites, and a questionnaire has been elaborated to be sent to all site The data gathered will be analysed at the end of managers. 1992 and case studies will be identified. The second phase of this project will include other types of World Heritage sites.

## 20th ANNIVERSARY OF THE WORLD HERITAGE CONVENTION

#### PROGRAMME

From 8 July to 9 October 1992, UNESCO Headquarters, 7 Place de Fontenoy, will host a major exhibition on the World Heritage, and a series of specific exhibitions on a number of countries. Parallel to this exhibition, conferences and film projections, as well as artistic evenings of various countries will be organized.

The general exhibition (Hall Miro and Salle des Pas Perdus) will present an overview of the World Heritage with over 150 photographs of sites or monuments from more than 80 countries, and including objects, models, maps, video films etc. A computer demonstration will provide additional information on a selection of these sites and posters, pins, brochures, T-shirts etc. will be available to the public.
