**Information document: Financial appropriations of other sectors and units of UNESCO in favour of World Heritage**

**SUMMARY**

**This document responds to the request of the Bureau at its twentieth session in June 1996 in Paris (para. VII.18 (d) of the Report of the Rapporteur). It presents the different interventions of the sectors and units of the Organization in favour of World Heritage properties, such as are inventoried by the central budgetary services of UNESCO.**

## **1. Introduction**

1.1 At its twentieth session (June 1996, Paris), the Bureau of the World Heritage Committee requested that the Secretariat provide information on the contributions of other sectors and units of UNESCO concerning World Heritage.

"VII.18 The Director noting the comments of the Bureau, stated that the Secretariat will make its best efforts to present the budget and financial account documents for the next Committee meeting in Merida, containing the information requested by the Bureau, notably:

- ....
- (d) a synoptic report on the budget relations between the Centre and the rest of the UNESCO units with regard to World Heritage activities;"

1.2 In order to regroup the information on the financial allocations carried out by other sectors and units of UNESCO for activities relating to World Heritage, the Centre used the central database of "UNESCO and its Member States". This database provides information on UNESCO's activities carried out, or financed in a given year by subject and beneficiary through a review of budgetary documents of the Organization (recording of obligations of expenditure).

1.3 Although this method provides the advantage of a standardization of research on the Organization as a whole, as well as a classification covering all activities for which an obligation of expenditure was made during the period under examination, it should not be considered as a complete set of data on this subject.

1.3.1 In fact, incomplete, overgeneralized or erroneous recordings of accountable items would eliminate them from the review. In the same way, this type of research does not reveal the activities undertaken during the year under examination when funding was obligated during the preceding year or decided for this year, and the obligation of funds not yet effected at the time of this review.

1.3.2 Finally, these tables represent only actions which specifically relate to cultural or natural heritage on a country by country basis. Other actions which may have an indirect or may not appear to have a direct influence on World Heritage sites (eg. Support to the General Directorate of Antiquities, World Heritage promotion for a publication, etc.) are not recorded in this presentation.

1.4 The figures presented in the following table permit at least a global overview of funds expended on activities implemented by the other units of UNESCO for World Heritage.

## 2. Presentation of information and the glossary

### 2.1 Presentation of information

The tables which follow are prepared in the format herebelow:

This applies to all countries as well as for all the regions and activities identified as being international. The information is presented in a series of tables: Africa, Latin America and the Caribbean, Arab States, Asia and the Pacific, Europe, International.

Each region comprises, in columns, countries and their sites, and the regional activities. The "international" table groups actions which do not have a regional or specific national character: this includes those activities which cover countries of different regions, or regional groups.

The activities by type, originating sector of the activity (notably, the Sectors of Science, Culture, Education, Central Services, and particularly the Divisions of Ecological Sciences and Cultural Heritage, and the Division for Renovation of Educational Curricula and Structure of the Education Sector, as well as the UNESCO Publishing Office) are presented in columns. For each categorized Division the origin of funds is given: UNESCO Regular Programme, or extrabudgetary sources.

The totals of the funds identified are provided by division, type of funding and total:

- by site
- by country and overall regional activities
- by region and overall international activities
- overall activities
