7.3 Report on the Reinforced Monitoring Mechanism

SUMMARY

This document summarises in tabular form the activities undertaken under the reinforced monitoring mechanism adopted by the World Heritage Committee at its 31st session (Christchurch, 2007) in Decision **31 COM 5.2.** A full report on the implementation of this mechanism will be presented to the 33rd session of the World Heritage Committee in 2009.

I. Introduction

- 1. The reinforced monitoring mechanism adopted by the 31st session of the World Heritage Committee (Decision 31 COM 5.2) has been applied to 3 cases specifically at the request of the World Heritage Committee: Dresden Elbe Valley (Germany), Old City of Jerusalem and its Walls and the five natural heritage properties in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. At the meeting of the World Heritage Centre with the Advisory Bodies in September 2007, the mechanism was reviewed and coordination among the activities discussed. Furthermore the issue of lack of resources was raised, notably in order to undertake the required missions and translation of the final Report sent to the Committee, as no funds were allocated with Decision 31 COM 5.2.
- 2. The World Heritage Centre notes furthermore, that at the time of the adoption of the reinforced monitoring mechanism, no decision on the timeframe has been taken and therefore suggests that renewal of the application of the mechanism to a specific property has to be decided at each session of the World Heritage Committee.

II. Table of Activities

3. The following table highlights the missions carried out under the reinforced monitoring mechanism. The World Heritage Centre and the Advisory Bodies have been in constant contact and dialogue with the authorities concerned to follow-up on the Decisions of the World Heritage Committee. This is reflected in the respective State of Conservation reports under item 7A (see Document *WHC-08/32.COM/7A*).

- 4. <u>Decides</u> to allocate an amount of 35,000 USD for the implementation of the Reinforced Monitoring Mechanism, from the World Heritage Fund for 2008-2009.
