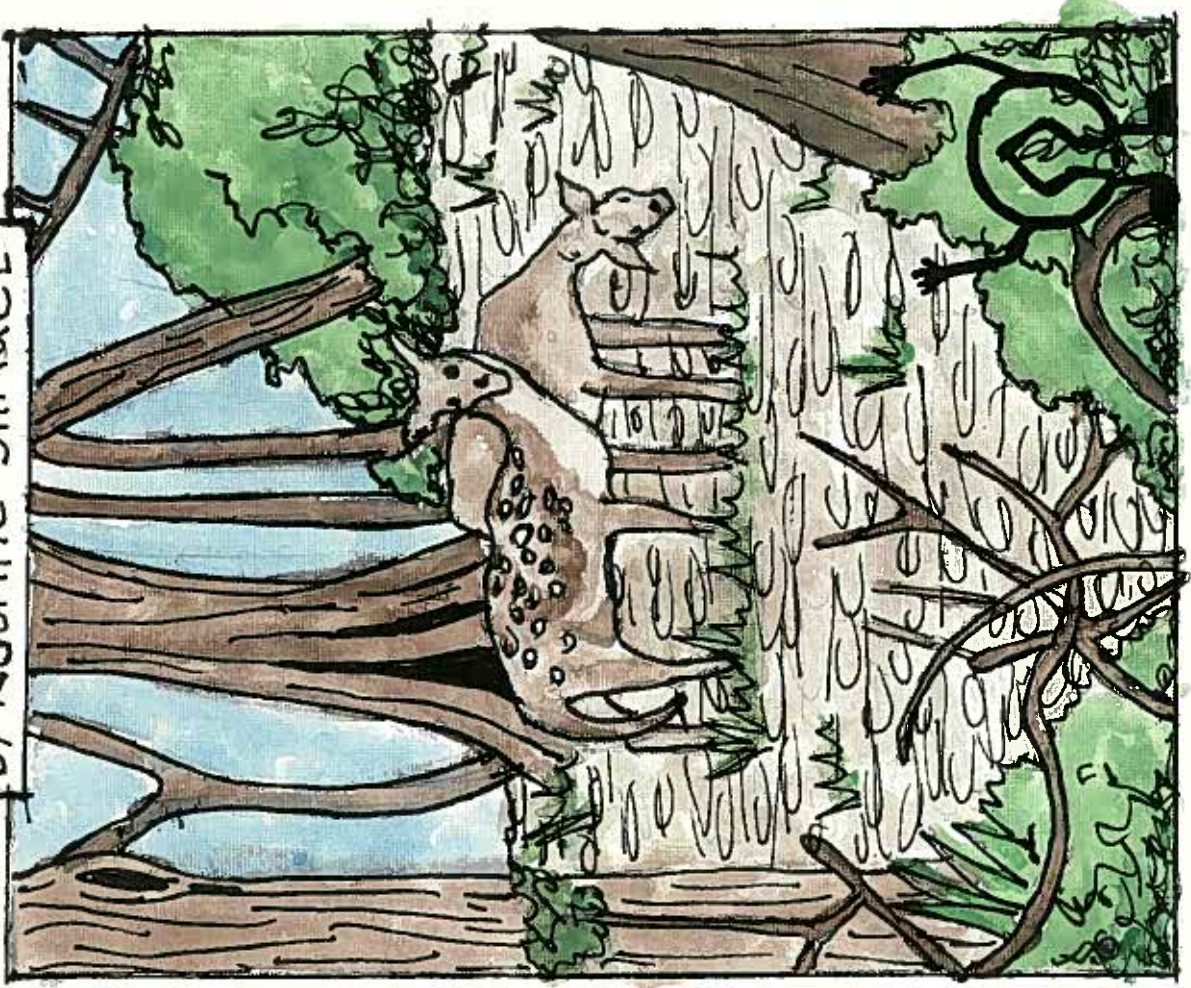

Four months later, the rainy season came.



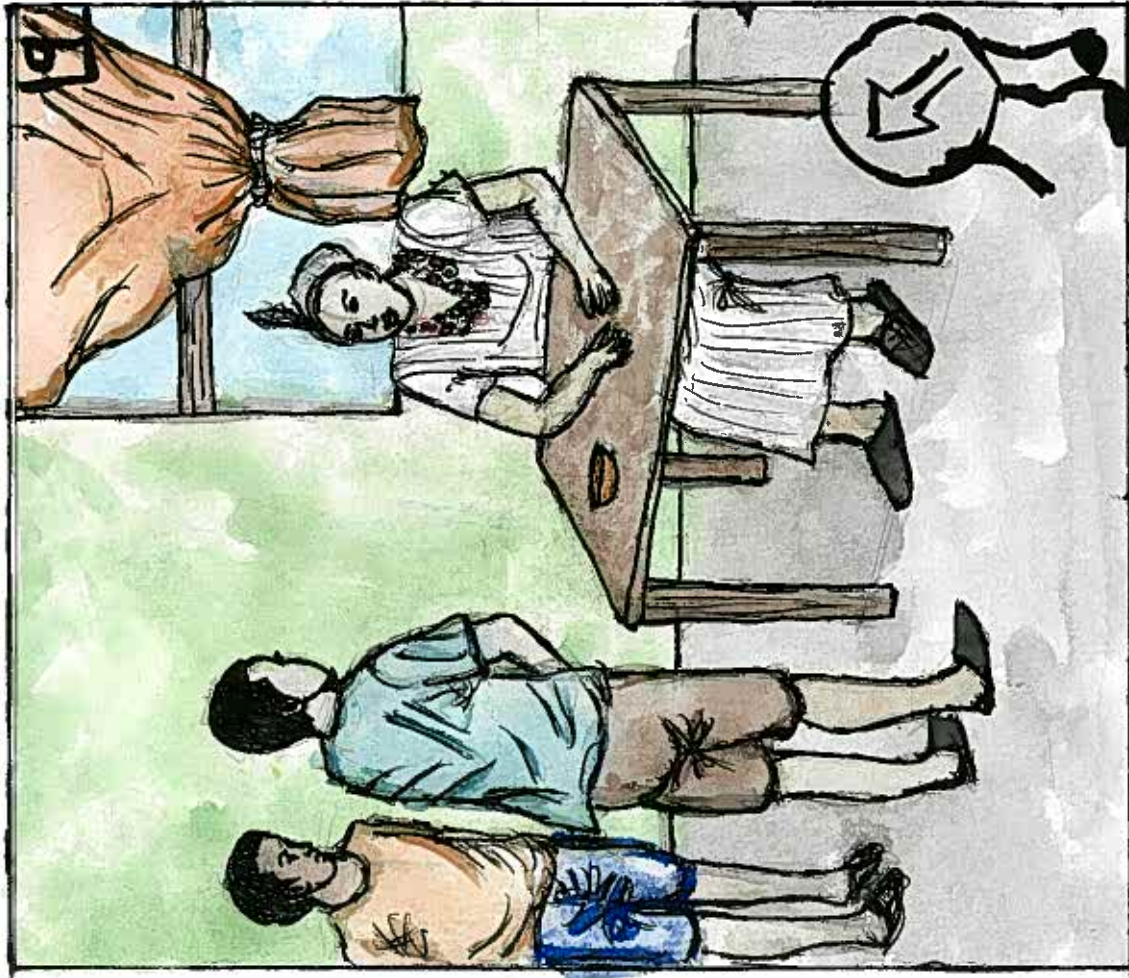
Since the rain fell very heavily and no tree to block the heavy rain, it destroyed houses.

they help the chief to open an office (forestry and wildlife center) were any body could take permission to enter the forest



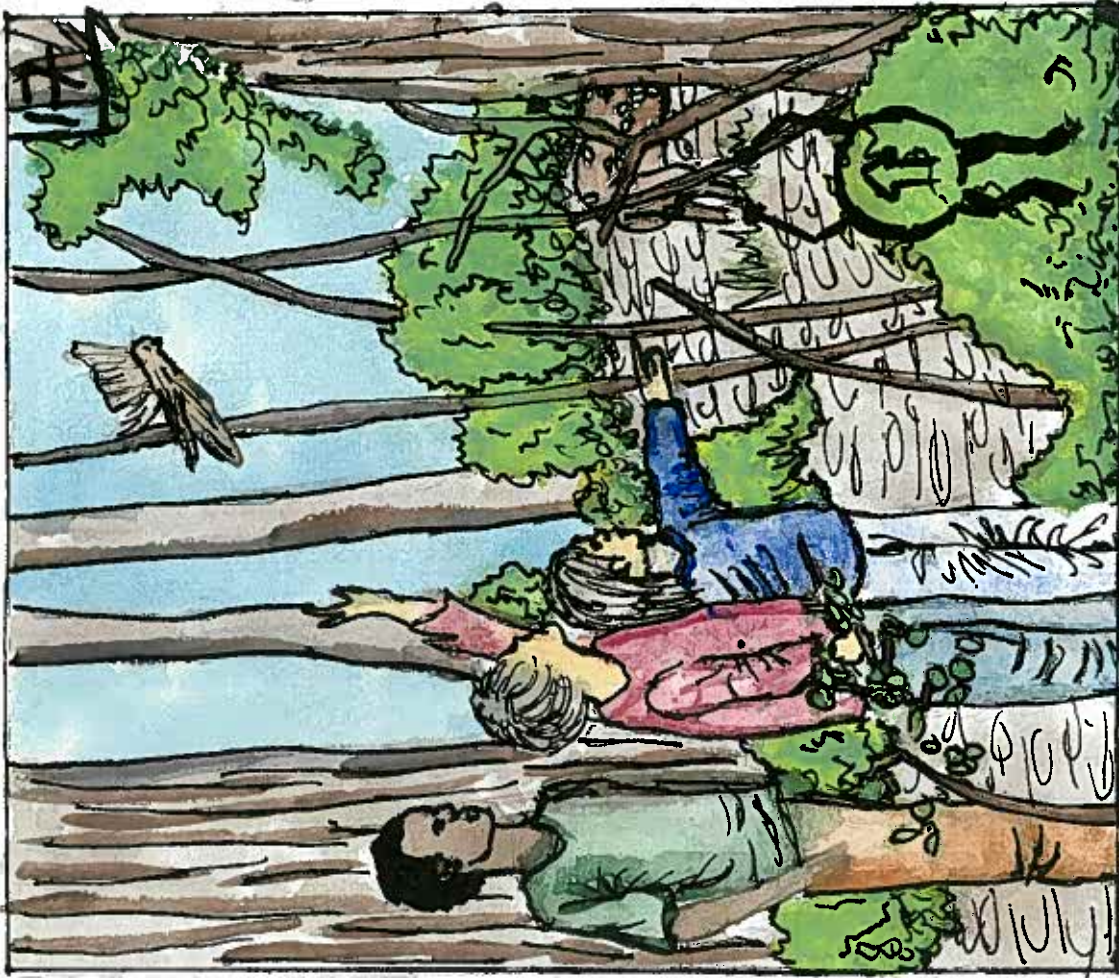
They placed forest guards in the forest to take care of the animals in the forest



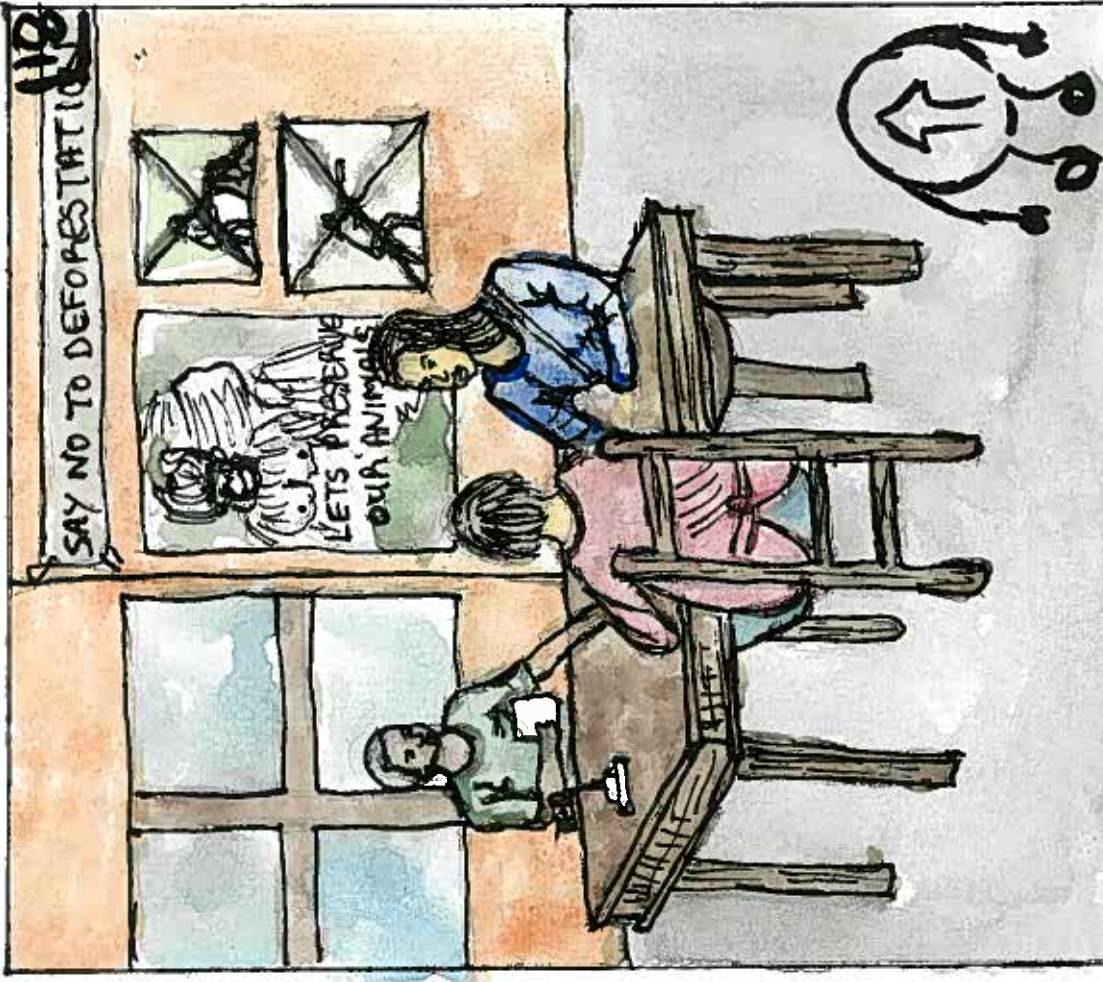
A hunter was caught by the forest guards, was arrested,



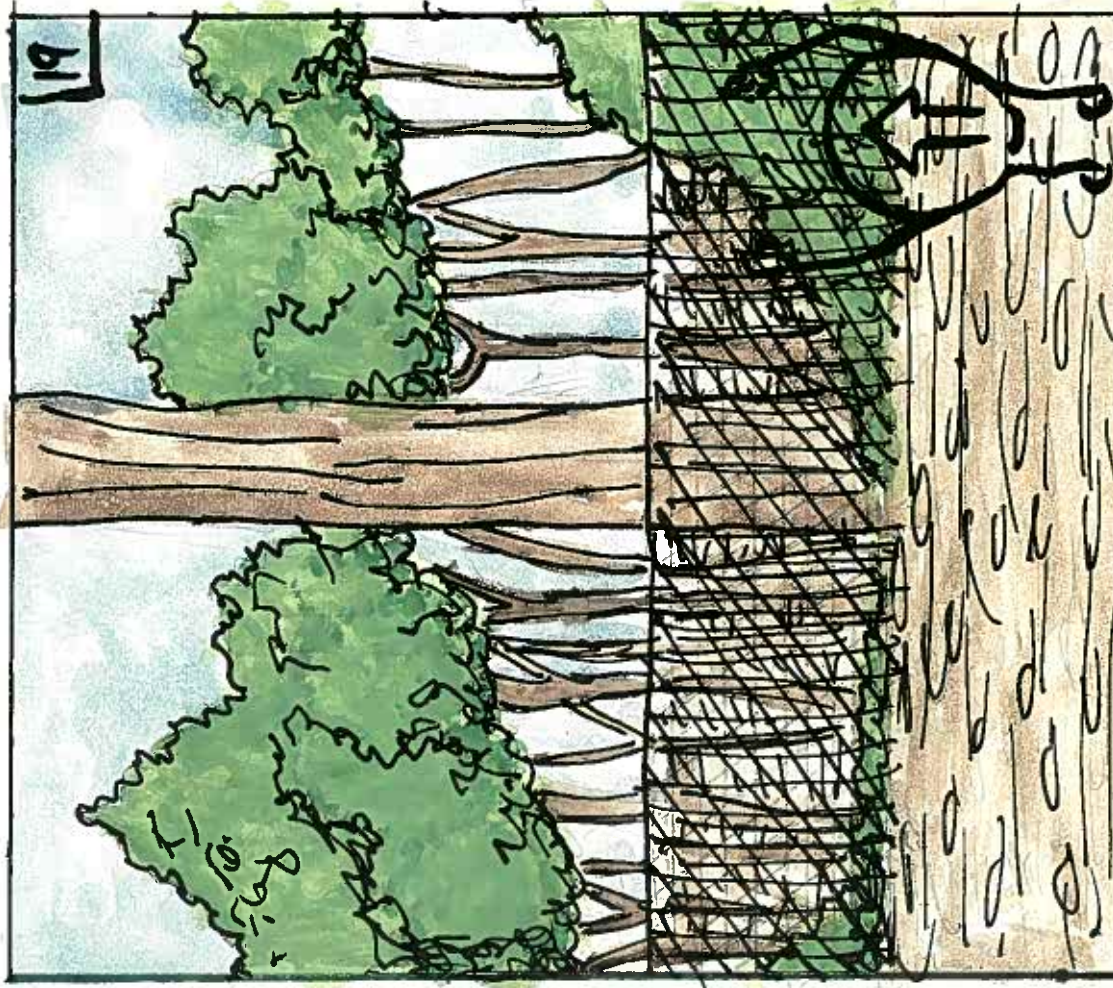
and locked up in the prison



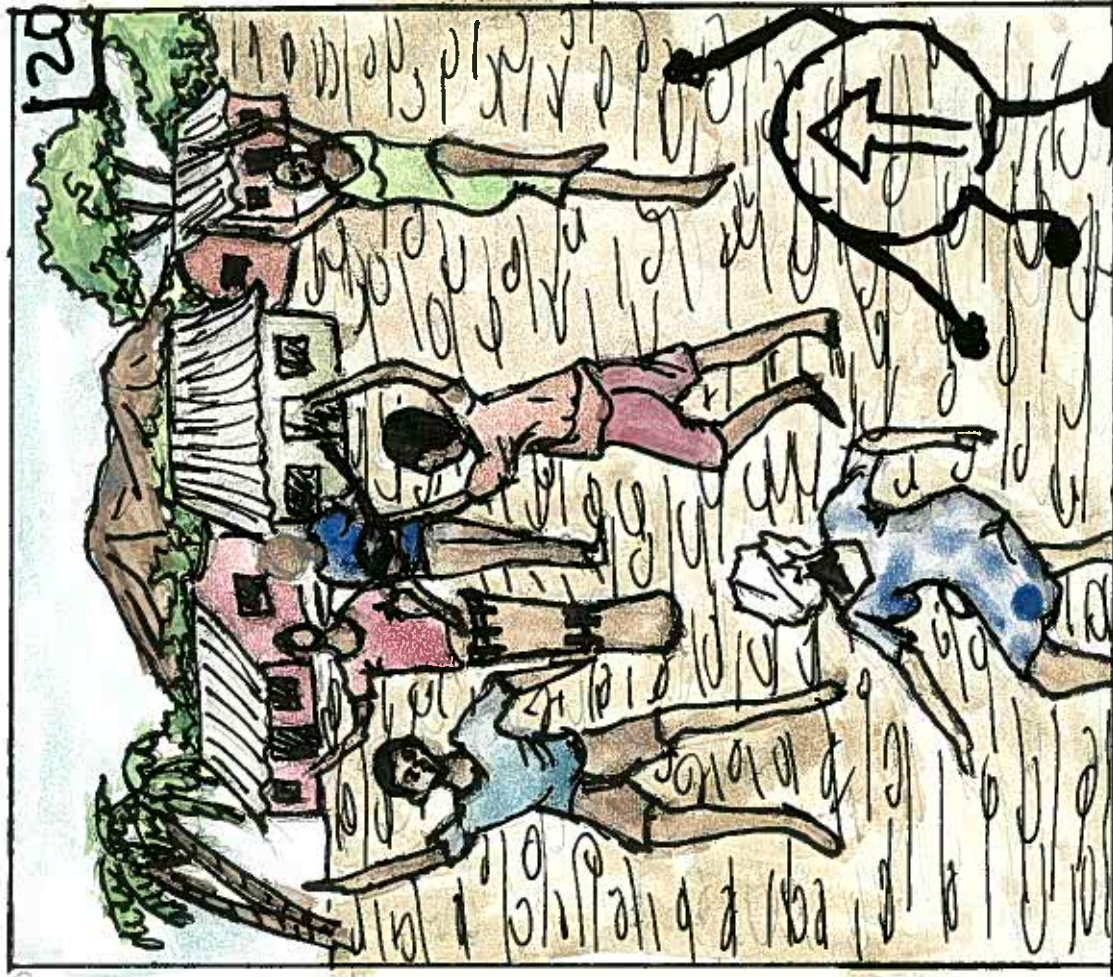
Tourist who visited the forest were very happy to see many animals and decided to open a research center in the village.
