




Capacity building

Scale of training requirement underestimated

International and political support

Best results obtained by interventions from "outside" partners rather than the field based partners

Conservation "diplomacy" under the UN umbrella requires sustained follow-up

Cooperation with the military is sometimes necessary but only on a case by case basis

Poor synergies between UN agencies in DRC led to missed opportunities

Neutral status for World Heritage Sites a priority
